When water is scarce, especially potable drinking water, the people suffer a lot. Stories from Africa where potable drinking water is not available, or scarcely available, offers an invitation to people from all parts of the world to do some reflection and conscious effort to be responsible in water consumption.

There's another story concerning water that all of us are warned. According to environmentalists and green earth movement advocates, the earth is heating more due to the sun's rays piercing through a thin layer of defense in the sky. This brings about faster melting of ice on the polar zones and the water level in the oceans are rising to levels that are alarming. The Palau Archipelago, and many other archipelagos in the Pacific, experience this terrible phenomenon. Rising water levels claim their lands, pushing them to higher land levels. But Palau is struggling. There are no more lands to escape to. The rising water level is pushing Palau to leave their nation. It is a sad reality.

In the Bajau habitat, the fear of losing lands for housing is not even a problem. The Bajau settlers, who are partially nomadic, build their houses on water (well, on ocean floors actually). The rising of water levels does not bother them. In fact, to them the water is an advantage. They get their livelihood from the water. They feed on ocean produce.

Are Palauans meant to adapt to the rising water levels? Today, the people in the Pacific region, including Palauans, are advancing talks to advocate peace through prudent stewardships. We are enjoined by these advocacies to protect and conserve our common home. –30-





The Baptism of the Lord





Today, we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord!

The origin and foundation of Christian Baptism is Jesus. Before starting his public ministry, Jesus submitted himself to the baptism given by John the Baptist. The waters did not purify him; he cleansed the waters. "He comes to sanctify the Jordan for our sake . . . to begin a new creation through the Spirit and water" (St. Gregory Nazianzen, Liturgy of the Hours, I, 634).

Jesus' immersion in the water is a sign for all human beings of the need to die to themselves to do God's will. Jesus did not need to be baptized because he was totally faithful to the will of his Father and free from sin. However, he wanted to show his solidarity with human beings in order to reconcile them to the Father. By commanding his disciples to baptize all nations, he established the means by which people would die to sin-Original and actual-and begin to live a new life with God.
