**Fr. Cit's Column**

Love is a many splendored thing. This song describes the kind of love the world celebrates. It is filled with joy but also pain and frustration. The movie, whose title is the song's namesake, tells of a love between two different races, a thing worthy of ridicule and ostracization. Interracial marriage was rare especially between Caucasians, Asians or Africans. If it happened, then it was a violation of social norms, practically a runaway from reality, but proved capable of changing a world view of how love is lived.

To some extent, intermarriage (of really opposite races) has brought the world together. Marriage made people accept each other and bridge gaps that were once irreconcilable. Through the dynamics of love and intermarriage, people have understood that each person is an equal. Though truly the project of respecting each other's differences and promoting the dignity of all people is still a big task and a long one, but we have made some progress. Not bad.

This good has its own disadvantages. Like anything that can be abused, interracial love and marriage were infiltrated by selfishness and lust and pride.

In a TV documentary, a story of a Dutch sperm donor was told. He was conquering the online world of Asians who were looking for a different match. They are Asian women who are wanting to have children of Caucasian father. No, they do not want a relationship. Or probably they do. But a high bred child is all they want. Many of them enter into complicated love set-up to fulfill the goal.

Now this unbelievable story is happening in real life. A young Dutch is offering free "seed" for wanting Asian women. The catch: all travel and immigration procedures expenses paid by the wanting woman.

What is supposed to be a good is abused and reduced to a commodity. Why do we go in this direction? Ignorance? Or pride? I think it is pride more than ignorance. We want to outmode God.-30-

El amor es algo esplendor. Esta canción describe el tipo de amor que el mundo celebra. Está lleno de alegría, pero también de dolor y frustración. La película, cuyo título es el homónimo de la canción, habla de un amor entre dos razas diferentes, algo digno de ridículo y ostracismo. El matrimonio interracial era raro especialmente entre caucásicos, asiáticos o africanos. Si sucedió, entonces fue una violación de las normas sociales, prácticamente una huida de la realidad, pero demostró ser capaz de cambiar una visión del mundo de cómo se vive el amor.

Hasta cierto punto, el matrimonio (de razas realmente opuestas) ha unido al mundo. El matrimonio hizo que la gente se aceptara mutuamente y cerrara brechas que antes eran irreconcilables. A través de la dinámica del amor y el matrimonio, la gente ha entendido que cada persona es igual.

Aunque verdaderamente el proyecto de respetar las diferencias de los demás y promover la dignidad de todos los pueblos sigue siendo una gran tarea y un largo, hemos hecho algunos progresos. Bien.

Este bien tiene sus propias desventajas. Como cualquier cosa que pueda ser abusada, el amor interracial y el matrimonio fueron infiltrados por el egoísmo, la lujuria y el orgullo.

En un documental de televisión, se contó una historia de un donante holandés de esperma. Estaba conquistando el mundo en línea de los asiáticos que estaban buscando un partido diferente. Son estas mujeres asiáticas que quieren tener hijos de padre caucásico. No, no quieren relaciones. O probablemente lo hagan. Pero un niño de alta raza es todo lo que quieren. Muchos de ellos entran en complicado conjunto de amor para cumplir la meta.

Ahora esta increíble historia está sucediendo en la vida real. Un joven holandés está ofreciendo "semilla" gratuita para las mujeres asiáticas que quieren. La trampa: todos los gastos de viajes y procedimientos de inmigración pagados por la mujer que quiere.

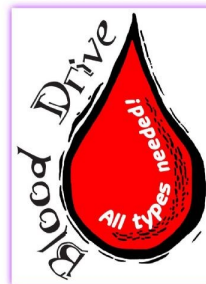


**Rummage Sale**

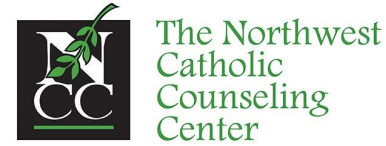

**Our Lady of Fatima**

We celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima on May 13.



Mary appeared to three peasant children near Fatima, Portugal, six times between May 13 and October 13, 1917, and asked for prayers for world peace and an end to World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia. She entrusted the children with three secrets, regarding devotion to her Immaculate Heart, a vision of hell, and a "bishop in white" shot by soldiers firing bullets and arrows. Many connect the third secret to the attempted assassination of Blessed Pope John Paul II on May 13, 1981, and the pope thanked Mary for guiding the bullet and saving him. At the Vatican, Pope Francis has stood before the statue of Our Lady from the Fatima shrine and formally entrusted the world to Mary.
