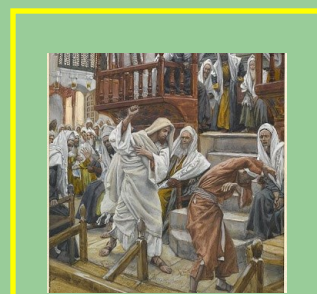

Fr. Cit's Column We surely miss our 4th of July celebrations. This year would be our second year to be deprived of the usual celebrations. We can't wait no longer to have the normal back, for when these important dates come, and we are prevented to celebrate the usual way, the more we feel we are robbed of the normal. I don't blame those whose patience had waned. Who can't ignore basic rules if it meant happiness, if it allows us to do what we enjoy doing? Wedding. Birthday. Anniversary. These are very important celebrations we can't simply pass. Thus, though hard and terrifying, we take the chance.

When the re-opening was started, so the conversations on the 4th of July celebrations started to circulate. And we compare. Why do they do this? Why can't we do the usual? How can we enjoy this important date if we will be skipping some of the usual community events again?

In due time, I know, things will be reset. Our patience and cooperation are required while we are still waiting for that time. That means, we are enjoined to observe safety measures for the protection of our people. We can reinvent our celebrations.
