**Fr. Cit's Column** Pastoral care. Care is a significant character in all creation with the faculty of the mind and heart and soul. In the Sacred Scriptures, care is God's top character, in that, wherever there is need, he goes. The beautiful image that comes to mind is Jesus embracing the sinner, a reflection of Jesus whose arms are stretched on the Cross. A mother does not forget, the Scripture says, but even if the mother forgets, I will not forget you. Beautiful words.

My exposure to care is the dynamic of the Asian culture. Our kind of care is ridiculous. It has no boundaries, and it does not stop. I like it as much as I do not like it. For you to understand what I am saying, here are some examples of that dynamic.

First, it is protective. Our parents tell us what to do and not do. From the fashion we wear to the activities we do; from who to be friends with to who we marry; from what kind of work we shall do to the encouragement of staying in the same job forever. We obey our parents perseveringly because we believe they are filled with wisdom, which can help us to get on the right path.

Second, it is self-giving and unconditional. Care for us is not motivated by rewards. It is always anchored on the good of the other. The self, though important in the equation, it is always the last. The best things we have are kept securely. They only "come out" from the closet when a guest comes. At first glance, it can be regarded as self-centered, self-preserving act. It looks like a show-off to the other. Actually, it is a Christian expression of love. Why do I say that? By "reserving" the good for the other, even to the point of "depriving" oneself of the immediate good, is a beautiful expression of the generosity of God and trust in the providence of the Lord. We may not be rewarded here on earth, but we know we have earned, or saved, wealth in heaven.

Third, it is forever. We do not stop care no matter what the circumstance is. One outward sign is the unselfish service of our parents until their last breath. No one is sent out or demanded of payment when they do not leave home. They continue to assist their children and their children's children without counting the cost. Their happiness is seeing they are still able to parent their children at all times.

I like that love because it is self-giving and unconditional. I do not like it because I feel like my freedom is not respected. Oh, is that why I feel God's care is ridiculous too? -30-

**Cuidado Pastoral.** El cuidado es un carácter significativo en toda la creación con la facultad de la mente y el corazón y el alma. En las Sagradas Escrituras, el cuidado es el carácter superior de Dios, en que, dondequiera que haya necesidad, él va. La hermosa imagen que viene a la mente es Jesús abrazando al pecador, un reflejo de Jesús cuyos brazos se extienden sobre la Cruz. Una madre no olvida, dice la Escritura, pero incluso si la madre olvida, no te olvidaré. Hermosas palabras.

Mi exposición al cuidado es la dinámica de la cultura asiática. Nuestro tipo de atención es ridícula que les parezca. No tiene fronteras y no se detiene. Me gusta tanto como no me gusta. Para que entiendan lo que estoy diciendo, aquí hay algunos ejemplos de esa dinámica.

En primer lugar, es protector. Nuestros padres nos dicen qué hacer y qué no hacer. Desde la moda que usamos hasta las actividades que hacemos; desde con quién ser amigos hasta con quién nos casamos; desde qué tipo de trabajo haremos hasta el estímulo de permanecer en el mismo trabajo para siempre. Obedecemos a nuestros padres perseverantemente porque creemos que están llenos de sabiduría, lo que puede ayudarnos a tomar el camino correcto.

En segundo lugar, es abundado e incondicional. El cuidado por nosotros no está motivado por recompensas. Siempre está anclado en el bien del otro. El yo, aunque importante en la ecuación, siempre es el último. Las mejores cosas que tenemos se mantienen de forma segura. Ellos a solo "salir" desde el armario cuando un huésped viene. A primera vista, se puede considerar como un acto egocéntrico y autoconservado. Parece un al show-off para el otro. En realidad, es una expresión cristiana de amor. ¿Por qué digo esto? Al "reservar" el bien para el otro, incluso hasta el punto de "privarse" del bien inmediato, es una hermosa expresión de la generosidad de Dios y la confianza en la providencia del Señor. Nadie es enviado o exigido de pago cuando no sale de casa. Siguen ayudando a sus hijos y a los hijos de sus hijos sin contar el costo. Su felicidad es ver que todavía son capaces de criar a sus hijos en todo momento.

Me gusta ese amor porque es abundado e incondicional. No me gusta porque siento que no se respeta mi libertad. Oh, ¿es por eso que siento que el cuidado de Dios también es ridículo? -30-

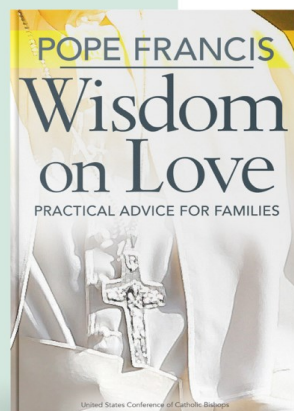

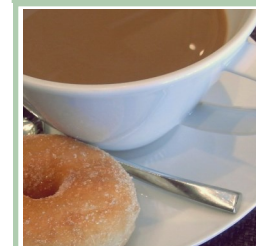

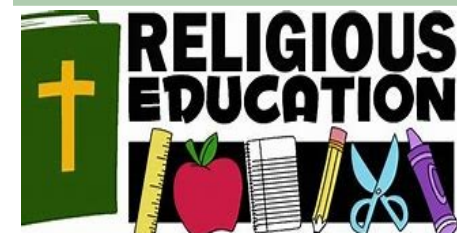

**Lifting of Dispensation from Excuse of Sunday Mass Attendance July 16, 2021.**

Due to the progression of situation in our State, the lifting of Covid-19 measures changed the way things are done in gatherings, including our Church gatherings. We have enforced that since the first weekend of July. On July 16th, the standing dispensation is abolished with the Decree rescinding the dispensation issued on July 1st by the Archbishop Sample. Therefore, beginning the weekend of July 17th and 18th, all faithful have to fulfill their Sunday and Holy day Obligation, but for a just cause, a pastor may dispense a faithful as provided by Can. 1245.
