Fr. Cit's Column

The wedding at Cana and the hour of Jesus. The purpose of the Evangelist, John the Beloved, was to issue to Jewish Christians an encouragement to freely profess faith in Christ, the Messiah. To invite them to be true to their Christian faith and courageously practice it without fearing Jewish persecutions, John the beloved told this Christ event, a story that tells Jesus is indeed the Messiah. If they believe Jesus is the Christ, the practice of faith must be intentional and without reserva-

The same invitation is issued to our faith practice: are we intentional believers and disciples of Christ?

Let us be taught by the richness of this story of the wedding at Cana in relation to how we understand and encounter Christ the redeemer. Beginning with the wedding, the occasion is a prefiguration of the coming of God's Kingdom. Like a bride, Israel will be espoused; no longer abandoned but loved. In the New Testament, the Church is Christ's bride. He loves the bride deeply that he gave his life for the love of the bride, despite her unworthiness. But through Christ's sacrifice, she will be cleansed.

The wedding at Cana foretells Jesus's sacrifice for the purification of the bride. When Jesus was bothered by his mother about the wine running out while the party was not yet over, Jesus retorted with a seeming defiant response: "How does that concern me, woman? My hour has not yet come." But Mary was unfazed and told the servants: "Do what he tells you."

There were six stone jars used for ritual ablutions by Jewish faithful. He ordered them to fill them with water which he turned to wine.

This rich symbolism points to Christ's sacrifice, of pouring his own blood for the cleansing of the Church. Reginald fuller says: There the older will be replaced by new. This is what the changing of the water into wine symbolizes. The real final epiphany is the cross. -30-

Las bodas de Caná y la hora de Jesús. El propósito del evangelista, Juan el Amado, era dar a los cristianos judíos un estímulo para profesar libremente la fe en Cristo, el Mesías. Para invitarlos a ser fieles a su fe cristiana y practicarla valientemente sin temor a las persecuciones judías, Juan el amado contó este evento de Cristo, una historia que dice que Jesús es de hecho el Mesías. Si creen que Jesús es el Cristo, la práctica de la fe debe ser intencional y sin reservas.

La misma invitación se emite a nuestra práctica de fe: ¿somos creyentes intencionales y discípulos de Cristo?

Dejémonos enseñar por la riqueza de esta historia de las bodas de Caná en relación con cómo entendemos y encontramos a Cristo redentor. Comenzando con la boda, la ocasión es una prefiguración de la venida del Reino de Dios. Como una novia, Israel será abrazado; ya no abandonado sino amado. En el Nuevo Testamento, la Iglesia es la novia de Cristo. Él ama profundamente a la novia que dio su vida por el amor de la novia, a pesar de su indignidad. Pero a través del sacrificio de Cristo, ella será limpiada.

La boda de Caná predice el sacrificio de Jesús por la purificación de la novia. Cuando su madre le molestó a Jesús que el vino se agotara mientras la fiesta aún no había terminado, Jesús replicó con una aparente respuesta desafiante: "¿Cómo me preocupa eso, mujer? Mi hora aún no ha llegado". Pero María no se inmutó y les dijo a los siervos: "Haced lo que él os diga".

Había seis jarras de piedra utilizadas para abluciones rituales por fieles judíos. Les ordenó que los llenaran con agua que convirtió en vino.—30-



# Tidbits about the **Sacra**ment of Matrimony from the Catechism of the Catholic Church



THURS. JAN. 20, 2022

1660 The marriage covenant, by which a man and a woman form with each other an intimate communion of life and love, has been founded and endowed with its own special laws by the Creator. By its very nature it is ordered to the good of the couple, as well as to the generation and education of children. Christ the Lord raised marriage between the baptized to the dignity of a sacrament (cf CIC, can. 1055 # 1; cf. GS 48 # 1). 1662 Marriage is based on the consent of the contracting parties, that is, on their will to give themselves, each to the other, mutually and definitively, in order to live a covenant of faithful and fruitful love. 1664 Unity, indissolubility, and openness to fertility are essential to marriage. Polygamy is incompatible with the unity of marriage; divorce sepa-

rates what God has joined together; the refusal of fertility turns married life away from its "supreme gift," the child (GS 50 # 1). 1665 The remarriage of persons divorced from a living, lawful spouse contravenes the plan and law of God as taught by Christ. They are not separated from the Church, but they cannot receive Eucharistic communion. They will lead Christian lives especially by educating their children in the faith.
