Laity and the church ministry. I have heard from old folks about the Traditional Mass and the way the baptized participate in Church's life. Church's life here does not only mean going to Mass. But the idea of the laity's participation in the Church's life long time ago only refers to a very limited path until the revolution that was engendered though the Protestant revolt and their implemented reforms breaking the path for the Catholic hierarchy to see for itself the movement of the Holy Spirit. We lose some; we gain some, as the old adage says.

At Mass, in the Traditional Rite, only the bishop (or the priest) "celebrates" while the laity "attends". They say they were not actually attending. Since the Mass was in Latin, and they only have memorized the responses, for the most part, Mass goes pray other prayers. In the Novus Ordo (which is this Mass that we celebrate) the bishop (or the priest) is the main celebrant and the people actively participates at Mass. And we can see that from the obvious. Many ministries that were reserved to the instituted ministers before (referring to the men who were on the path to religious life or diaconate or priesthood) are now relegated to the baptized not by institution but by commissioning. However, the latest reform promulgated by the Vatican is the institution of the laity to the ministry of lecturing and catechizing. I have no further information about this institution, but I promise to discuss it later in more depth.

What changes we see as compared before? Apart from the active participation of the laity at Mass by serving in ministries like the Word and the Eucharist, which is not limited to men or boys, we also see more leadership roles assumed by the laity and evangelizing ministries that are taken by many lay preachers.

One thing is sure here: that the Church is listening to the inspiration of the Holy Spirit the way she did from the time Jesus rose from the dead and returned to the Father. We trust the people who are given this role to discern for the good of all the church faithful.-30-

Los laicos y el ministerio de la iglesia. He escuchado de ancianos sobre la Misa Tradicional y la forma en que los bautizados participan en la vida de la Iglesia. La vida de la Iglesia aquí no solo significa ir a misa. Pero la idea de la participación de los laicos en la vida de la Iglesia hace mucho tiempo sólo se refiere a un camino muy limitado hasta la revolución engendrada por la revuelta protestante y sus reformas implementadas rompiendo el camino para que la jerarquía católica se vea por sí misma el movimiento del Espíritu Santo. Perdemos algunos; ganamos algunos, como dice el viejo adagio.

En la Misa, en el Rito Tradicional, sólo el obispo (o el sacerdote) "celebra" mientras los laicos "asisten". Dicen que en realidad no estaban asistiendo. Puesto que la Misa estaba en latín, y sólo han memorizado las respuestas, en su mayor parte, los porteros de la Misa oran otras oraciones. En el Novus Ordo (que es esta Misa que celebramos) el obispo (o el sacerdote) es el celebrante principal y la gente participa activamente en la Misa. Y eso lo podemos ver desde lo obvio. Muchos ministerios que antes estaban reservados a los ministros instituidos (refiriéndose a los hombres que estaban en el camino hacia la vida religiosa o el diaconado o el sacerdocio) ahora están relegados a los bautizados no por institución sino por encargo. Sin embargo, la última reforma promulgada por el Vaticano es la institución de los laicos al ministerio de lectura y catequesis. No tengo más información sobre esta institución, pero prometo discutirla más adelante con más profundidad.

¿Qué cambios vemos en comparación con antes? Aparte de la participación activa de los laicos en la Misa sirviendo en ministerios como la Palabra y la Eucaristía, que no se limita a hombres o niños, también vemos más roles de liderazgo asumidos por los laicos y ministerios evangelizadores que son tomados por muchos predicadores laicos.

Una cosa es segura aquí: que la Iglesia está escuchando la inspiración del Espíritu Santo de la manera en que lo hizo desde el momento en que Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos y regresó al Padre. Confiamos en las personas a las que se les da este papel para discernir por el bien de todos los fieles de la iglesia.-30-

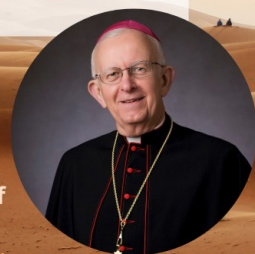

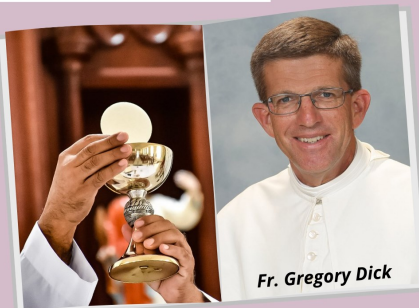

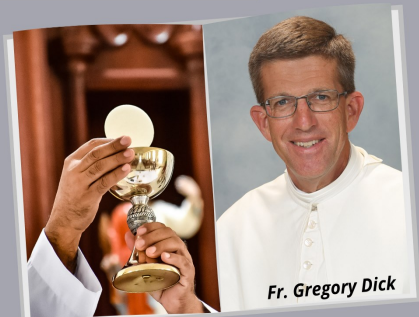

On the Vocation of the Laity taken from *Apostolicam Auctoritatem* by Pope Paul VI, Nov. 18, 1965

Chap 1. 2. The Church was founded for the purpose of spreading the kingdom of Christ throughout the earth for the glory of God the Father, to enable all men to share in His saving redemption, and that through them the whole world might enter into a relationship with Christ.

Chap 3. 3. The laity derive the right and duty to the apostolate from their union with Christ the head... The sacraments, however, especially the most holy Eucharist, communicate and nourish that charity which is the soul of the entire apostolate.

One engages in the apostolate through the faith, hope, and charity which the Holy Spirit diffuses in the hearts of all members of the Church... On all Christians therefore is laid the preeminent responsibility of working to make the divine message of salvation known and accepted by all men throughout the world.
