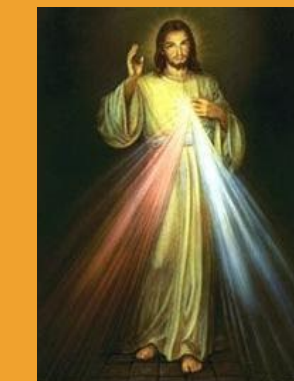

Fr. Cit's Column Divine Mercy Sunday. Often, we know the celebration but not necessarily the Feast's meaning in our faith and Christian living. I think, one great way to get us connected to what divine mercy is all about, and probably relate to a story that happens to a person called to mercy, I invite you to watch the film Fr. Stu. I have not watched the movie as of this writing. But I was in conversation with a friend who was lucky to be with Fr. Stu in Mt. Angel Seminary. Yes, Fr. Stu was a seminarian on the hill of Mt. Angel Abbey.

His conversion story is a story of mercy. Each time he was brought to a piece of the truth, God was leading him. Who would think that his rough life would take him to the seminary and become a priest of Christ?

I mean, for me honestly, coming from a very homogenized community of Christians, I had no idea conversion like Fr. Stu's can happen. Only simple conversion stories of Judases: from betrayal to faithfulness, are common. Nonetheless, the same mercy work in any of these, including my story and your story of success, joy, consolation, freedom, even the experience of desolation or unfreedom.

Yes, you and I have our own share of God's mercy working in many ways in our lives. We have plenty of them, but we may not actually realize God's mercy is at work. We only realize God's mercy at work after the fact. That is fine. The more that we become conscious to God's mercy means we also become more conscious of our relationship with Jesus.

But above all this, the very essence of this mercy is the undivided, unending and always ready and available love of God to each man and woman who is willing to be transformed. Why that fundamental? Because we are truly heavenly creatures who need to be returned there.- Domingo de la Misericordia Divina. A menudo conocemos la celebración, pero no necesariamente el significado de la Fiesta en nuestra fe y en nuestra vida cristiana. Creo que, una gran manera de conectarnos a lo que la misericordia divina es todo, y probablemente se relacionan con una historia que le sucede a una persona llamada a la misericordia, te invito a ver la película P. Stu. No he visto la película a partir de esta escritura. Pero yo estaba en conversación con un amigo que tuvo la suerte de estar con P. Stu en Mt. Seminario Angel. Sí, Fr. Stu era un seminarista en la colina del Monte Angel.

Su historia de conversión es una historia de misericordia. Cada vez que fue traído a una pieza de la verdad, Dios lo estaba guiando. ¿Quién pensaría que su dura vida lo llevaría al seminario y se convertiría en sacerdote de Cristo?

Quiero decir, para mí honestamente, viniendo de una comunidad de cristianos muy homogeneizada, no tenía idea de conversión como P. Stu pueden suceder. Sólo historias simples de conversión de Judas: De la traición a la fidelidad, son comunes. Sin embargo, la misma misericordia funciona en cualquiera de estos, incluyendo mi historia y su historia de éxito, alegría, consuelo, libertad, incluso la experiencia de desolación o de inlibertad. Sí, ustedes y yo tenemos nuestra parte de la misericordia de Dios trabajando de muchas maneras en nuestras vidas. Tenemos muchos de ellos, pero en realidad no nos damos cuenta de que la misericordia de Dios está en acción. Sólo nos damos cuenta de la misericordia de Dios en el trabajo después del hecho. Eso está bien. Cuanto más nos hacemos conscientes de la misericordia de Dios significa que también nos hacemos más conscientes de nuestra relación con Jesús.

Pero sobre todo esto, la esencia misma de esta misericordia es el amor indiviso, interminable y siempre listo y disponible de Dios a cada hombre y mujer que está dispuesto a ser transformado. ¿Por qué esto fundamentalmente? Porque somos criaturas verdaderamente celestiales que necesitan ser regresadas allí.-30-
