Fr. Cit's Column

Food and the risen Jesus. On the shore, a grill caught the attention of the apostles. Fish were on the grill. There was bread too.

Jesus invited them to eat breakfast with him.

Food is an opportunity (maybe an excuse) to celebrate ties, relationships and alliances. In the part of the world where I grew up, I was accustomed to meet people at table. "Come, dine with us." It does not matter what's on the table, whether there's enough, or how things would pan out with what's available. The thing is, central to this communion, the joy of sharing forges strength, builds up alliances and enforces the good and peace.

In this encounter at least, Peter and the disciples have confirmed that Jesus has risen. That also tells that the things that were said about Jesus were true. That strengthened their alliance as disciples and their commitment to witness to Christ. Thus, the growing and strengthening of the communities that were started from the apostles.

What I remember, we were extravagant. I knew we did not have much. It was quite a stretch to host a feast. We seldom did. But whenever we did, there was always plenty of food. But what was quite an exception, they would put on a feast when surprise visits happen.

Yes, unannounced visits are normal to us. We do not mind. In fact, we feel honored when we are visited by friends or relatives, even strangers. The beautiful thing that happens in this communion is the encounter. In the encounter, we are a family without blood distinctions or lines or relations. Only united by the beauty of sharing.

That's how Jesus invited his disciples and enjoined them to be proclaimers of Good News. Sharing. They share their lives, their love for God, their experience of everlasting grace. That's what we do at Mass. That's what we relive in the commemoration of Christ's offering his body and blood as food and drink.—30-

Al menos en este encuentro, Pedro y los discípulos han confirmado que Jesús ha resucitado. Eso también dice que las cosas que se dijeron acerca de Jesús eran verdaderas. Eso fortaleció su alianza como discípulos y su compromiso de dar testimonio de Cristo. Así, el crecimiento y fortalecimiento de las comunidades que se iniciaron desde los apóstoles. Lo que recuerdo, éramos extravagantes. Sabía que no teníamos mucho. Fue todo un tramo para organizar una fiesta. Rara vez lo hacíamos. Pero cada vez que lo hacíamos, siempre había mucha comida. Pero lo que era una excepción, se ponían de fiesta cuando se producían visitas sorpresa.

Sí, las visitas sin previo aviso son normales para nosotros. No nos importa. De hecho, nos sentimos honrados cuando nos visitan amigos o familiares, incluso extraños. Lo hermoso que sucede en esta comunión es el encuentro. En el encuentro, vivimos una familia sin distinciones de sangre ni líneas ni relaciones. Sólo unidos por la belleza de compartir. Así es como Jesús invitó a sus discípulos y los exhortó a ser proclamadores de la Buena Nueva. Compartición. Comparten sus vidas, su amor por Dios, su experiencia de gracia eterna.

Eso es lo que hacemos en la misa. Eso es lo que revivimos en la conmemoración de la ofrenda de Cristo de su cuerpo y sangre como alimento y bebida.—30-
