Fr. Cit's Column

Ordination. In order to spread the Word of God to all corners of the world, the Apostles set apart disciples and sent them to preach to communities Jesus is the Christ. This setting apart (to make sacred) becomes the Sacred Order (of deacon and priest). Ordination, as we call it, makes men who have reputable character and faith ministers of the Word of God.

To make sacred (consecrate), a man ordained to the diaconate or priestly ministry is anointed with the Sacred Chrism. The pouring of Sacred Chrism on the priest's palm is the ritual that makes him set apart, and that signifies he is sent (anointed) in order to proclaim the Good News to the world. He is admonished to "believe what you read; teach what you believe; practice what you teach". The admonition reflects the kind of life a priest lives. That is why, ordination does not happen overnight. Men are trained for a long time and they go through rigorous evaluations and recommendations until they are found less unworthy of the sacred call. The serious formation the seminarian goes through proves the Church needs and gets ministers who are well equipped and possesses character fit to be Jesus's ministers. I am convinced the Church is blessed with many holy and effective priests and deacons.

My ordination was a blessed day. Sad though, I was not able to bring family, not even my Mom, to witness the celebration. That was one unfortunate disadvantage of being an outsider (which has many implications of being a minister but an outsider among fellow Catholics). My Mom tried to get a visa but she was denied one. If she could only be believed at face value that she does not like to stay in the US, but as always is not easy to get permission to enter US.

Anyway, it was a blessed day because it was special. It was new birth as the day I was ordained was my birthday. That year, it was also the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, a devotion close to me. Since then, every year, I do not celebrate birthday. I celebrate a more important feast: my ordination anniversary.-30-

Ordenación. Para extender la Palabra de Dios a todos los rincones del mundo, los Apóstoles separaron a sus discípulos y los enviaron a predicar a las comunidades Jesús es el Cristo. Este aparto (hacer sagrado) se convierte en la Orden Sagrada (de diácono y sacerdote). La ordenación, como la llamamos, hace que los hombres que tienen un carácter de confianza y ministren la Palabra de Dios. Para hacer sagrado (consagrar), un hombre ordenado al diaconado o ministerio sacerdotal es ungido con el Sagrado Crisma. El derramamiento del Sagrado Crisma en la palma del sacerdote es el ritual que lo hace apartarlo, y eso significa que es enviado (ungido) para proclamar la Buena Nueva al mundo. Él está amonestado a "creer lo que usted lee; enseñar lo que usted cree; practicar lo que usted enseña".

La amonestación refleja el tipo de vida que vive un sacerdote. Por eso, la ordenación no ocurre de la noche a la mañana. Los hombres son entrenados por el tiempo más largo y pasan por evaluaciones y recomendaciones rigurosas hasta que se encuentran menos indignos de la llamada sagrada. La formación seria que atraviesa el seminarista demuestra que la Iglesia necesita y recibe ministros bien equipados y que poseen un carácter adecuado para ser ministros de Jesús. Estoy convencido de que la Iglesia ha sido bendecida con muchos sacerdotes y diáconos santos y eficaces.

Mi ordenación fue un día bendito Sad sin embargo, no pude traer a la familia, ni siquiera a mi mamá, para ser testigo de la celebración. Esa fue una desventaja desafortunada de ser un forastero (que tiene muchas implicaciones de ser un ministro pero un forastero entre los compañeros católicos). Mi mamá trató de obtener una visa pero se le negó una. Si sólo se le pudiera creer en valor nominal que no le gusta quedarse en los EE.UU., pero como siempre no es fácil obtener permiso para entrar en EE.UU. De todos modos, fue un día bendito porque era especial. Era un nuevo nacimiento ya que el día que fui ordenado era mi cumpleaños. Ese año, fue también la Fiesta del Inmaculado Corazón de María, una devoción cercana a mí. Cada año, no celebro el cumpleaños. Celebro una fiesta más importante, mi aniversario de ordenación.-30-
