Fr. Cit's Column

The pilgrim Church. The Church stands on a solid foundation, firm and immovable. According to St. Paul, no one can prevail over the

Church, not even the gates of hell will have power over it. Throughout the ages, with so many battles to endure, the power of the Gospel sustained and was spread widely. The message of God remained and planted in all fertile land, growing, flowering, bearing fruit. And as it continued to stay, the Kingdom of God was revealed forward.

Yes, the Church moves forward, while it stands on solid ground. She is pilgrim; she journeys ahead towards the coming of the Kingdom which God promised to all his chosen people. On the journey, she is both the guide and protector inspired by the advocate, who is also guide and protector. But the image of the Church as guide and protector is that of a mother. Like a mother, she spreads her wings to protect her brood. She leads them to their safety.

We can say that as a pilgrim, the Church is moving, speeding towards a destination. More than just that, she is actually evolving to become who she is, the new heavens and the new earth. In other words, she is becoming the fulfillment of the mind of God.

Becoming as opposed to arriving. She has to be the faithful steward expected when the bridegroom arrives. Thus, what is necessary here is transformation, not change of place or arriving at a destination.

What do we become? Agents of love. People of love. Manifestation of love. That is what God's vision of new heaven and new earth is. In Christ's priestly prayer, he prayed to the Father that the church, the people of God, may be one with him, just as he is one with the Father. To be grafted to him, we, his branches will only have life if we continue to be attached to him, the vine. And to bear fruit, the vinedresser has to prune the branches.

This image of unity is the fulfillment of love. When all are one with God and God has all the people in his Kingdom, the vision is completed.-30-

Según San Pablo, nadie puede prevalecer sobre la Iglesia, ni siquiera las puertas del infierno tendrán poder sobre ella. Por lo tanto, lo que es necesario aquí es la transformación, no el cambio de lugar o la llegada a un destino. ¿En qué nos convertimos? Agentes de amor. Gente de amor. Manifestación de amor. CHAPTER III
I BELIEVE IN THE HOLY SPIRIT
683 "No one can say 'Jesus is Lord' except by the Holy Spirit." "God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, 'Abba! Father!'"

"This knowledge of faith is possible only in the Holy Spirit: to be in touch with Christ, we must first have been touched by the Holy Spirit. He comes to meet us and kindles faith in us. By virtue of our Baptism, the first sacrament of the faith, the Holy Spirit in the Church communicates to us, intimately and personally, the life that originates in the Father and is offered to us in the Son.
