Only through our emulation of the good will their memory live on. Each of us should be a living memorial of those we look up to! Christians, we are a living memorial of Christ. If we easily gravitate to a good role model, for example, of a heroism, be it fictitious or real, as baptized, there should be more weight in our hearts the example of Christ and his saints.

The memorial of our forefathers surely has importance to us. We build in their honor mausoleum or monuments. They surely are a concrete remembrance that make us aware who they were and what they have gifted our communities with. They make the young aware of their good works and inspire them to aspire for greatness too.
