Fr. Cit's Column The Divine Image. Growing up, I have an imagery of God developed through the years from my parents' catechisms and examples. Yes, it developed beginning from what I understood as an always present, ever powerful, all-knowing power whose throne is up above to be something like the whole heavens. He makes the sun rise, the rain to fall, the clouds to come and to clear, to make the thunder and lightning appear, and from all these, life is sustained. If the heavens fall, then no life will survive.

I like to go back to that image of God when I need to be resolved about who God is. For me at least, that image helps me straighten up how I know God. I think, what makes it effective is that, that knowledge is pure and innocent. It is neither diluted nor magnified by various factors like studies, personal experiences and other external influences. Just plain and pure child's knowledge of God.

A child accepts truth and holds that truth dearly. An adult scrutinizes truth. When he finds a truth contrary to his beliefs, he rejects that truth.

God is objective truth. God, the truth, is repetitively rejected. Unfortunately, the truth (God) is rejected very normally by many intelligent people. The influx of information actually dilutes the knowledge about God, and that information is crucial to a believer who struggles to know God.

In my case, the confusion of varying thoughts about what God is and what not de- synthesizes that program instilled in me growing in faith. That is why, I have to unclog the portals where information passes so that I can cling to the pure knowledge of God where I started to grow as a disciple.

That's the mental process. The Spiritual process is prayer. Discernment. By coming to God, in his home, kneeling, freeing myself from any unimportant things let me know him better.- 30-

Un niño acepta la verdad y la tiene muy en cuenta. Un adulto escudriña la verdad. Cuando encuentra una verdad contraria a sus creencias, rechaza esa verdad. Dios es la verdad objetiva. Dios, la verdad, es repetidamente rechazado. Desafortunadamen- te, la verdad (Dios) es rechazada muy normalmente por muchas personas inteligentes. La afluencia de información en realidad diluye el conocimiento acerca de Dios, y esa información es crucial para un creyente que lucha por conocer a Dios.

En mi caso, la confusión de pensamientos variables sobre lo que Dios es y lo que no des- sintetiza ese programa me inculcó crecer en la fe. Por eso, tengo que desatascar los portales por donde pasa la información para poder aferrarme al conocimiento puro de Dios donde empecé a crecer como discípulo.

Ese es el proceso mental. El proceso espiritual es la oración. Discernimiento. Al venir a Dios, en su casa, arrodillándome, liberándome de cualquier cosa sin importancia, consigo que lo conozca mejor.-30-
