Fr. Cit's Column

Happy neighbors. I saw a growing neighborhood when I was growing up. At first, our neighbor closest to us was one older gentleman who was a wid-

ower. Our contemporaries were neighbors across the highway, which means, they were about a mile away from us and we have to cross the highway to get to their place. Later, that was not necessary because the married children of the older widower next to us had moved and built their house next to us. And then we also saw new houses built and stay. We all grew up together.

In many ways, we became family. Like a normal family, we help each other, understand each other and also disagree with each other. We quarreled and fought. And our parents became so involved they also fought with the intention of doing the good for us.

And then no matter how much we fought, there would always be that time when we could not fight any more for the welfare of each other was priority.

What was very beautiful in all of that was, through thick and thin, when the odds were not easy on either of us, we were ready to give up our personal priorities, beliefs and prejudices for the sake of the good. When the language of charity comes on top of everything, we instantaneously let the good work, respond to the need. How that occurs is sort of a wonder. What takes place is reconciliation without spelling out the words of pardon. We set aside the differences and hurts, and immediately we take action to what was needed at that time.

When Dad died, Tiyang Zeny was creatively helping us. Apart from lending us, for example, a cup of rice, she was also offering us opportunities to earn money. She became a sort of middle person for us. We did some projects with her from the looming and weaving projects she did with a local company. Through it, we were helped with our school fees.

I am indebted. I knew that little help from her allowed us to live day by day. She and her family are one special family for me. -30-

Y luego, no importa cuánto lucháramos, siempre habría un momento en que no pudiéramos luchar más por el bienestar de los demás era prioritario.

Lo que era muy hermoso en todo eso era, a través de grueso y delgado, cuando las probabilidades no eran fáciles en ninguno de nosotros, estábamos listos para renunciar a nuestras prioridades personales, creencias y prejuicios por el bien de los buenos. Cuando el lenguaje de la caridad viene encima de todo, dejamos instantáneamente el buen trabajo, respondiendo a la necesidad. Cómo esto ocurre es una especie de maravilla. Lo que ocurre es la reconciliación sin explicar las palabras del perdón. Dejamos a un lado las diferencias y las heridas, y de inmediato tomamos medidas para lo que se necesitaba en ese momento.

Cuando papá murió, Tiyang Zeny nos estaba ayudando creativamente. Aparte de prestarnos, por ejemplo, una taza de arroz, también nos ofrecía oportunidades de ganar dinero. Ella se convirtió en una especie de persona intermedia para nosotros. Hicimos algunos proyectos con ella desde los proyectos que se avecinaban y tejían con una compañía local. A través de él, nos ayudaron con nuestras cuotas escolares.

Estoy en deuda. Sabía que esa pequeña ayuda de ella nos permitía vivir el día a día. Ella y su familia son una familia especial para mí.-30-

Resurrection of Christ.

2192 "Sunday . . . is to be observed as the foremost holy day of obligation in the universal Church" (CIC, can. 1246 # 1). "On Sundays and other holy days of obligation the faithful are bound to participate in the Mass" (CIC, can. 1247).

2193 "On Sundays and other holy days of obligation the faithful are bound . . . to abstain from those labors and business concerns which impede the worship to be rendered to God, the joy which is proper to the Lord's Day, or the proper relaxation of mind and body" (CIC, can. 1247). 2247 "Honor your father and your mother" (Deut 5:16; Mk 7:10).

2248 According to the fourth commandment, God has willed that, after him, we should honor our parents and those whom he has vested with authority for our good.

2251 Children owe their parents respect, gratitude, just obedience, and assistance. Filial respect fosters harmony in all of family life.

2254 Public authority is obliged to respect the fundamental rights of the human person and the conditions for the exercise of his freedom.

2256 Citizens are obliged in conscience not to follow the directives of civil authorities when they are contrary to the demands of the moral order. "We must obey God rather than men" (Acts 5:29).

Love God. Love your neighbor as yourself.

From the Catechicm of the Catholic Church

2133 "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul and with all your strength" (Deut 6:5).

2134 The first commandment summons man to believe in God, to hope in him, and to love him above all else.

2135 "You shall worship the Lord your God" (Mt 4:10). Adoring God, praying to him, offering him the worship that belongs to him, fulfilling the promises and vows made to him are acts of the virtue of religion which fall under obedience to the first commandment.

2140 Since it rejects or denies the existence of God, atheism is a sin against the first commandment.

2160 "O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth" (Ps 8:1)! 2161 The second commandment enjoins respect for the Lord's name. the name of the Lord is holy.

2162 The second commandment forbids every improper use of God's name. Blasphemy is the use of the name of God, of Jesus Christ, of the Virgin Mary, and of the saints in an offensive way.

2163 False oaths call on God to be witness to a lie. Perjury is a grave offence against the Lord who is always faithful to his promises.

2189 "Observe the sabbath day, to keep it holy" (Deut 5:12). "The seventh day is a sabbath of solemn rest, holy to the Lord" (Ex 31:15).

2190 The sabbath, which represented the completion of the first creation, has been replaced by Sunday which recalls the new creation inaugurated by the
