Fr. Cit's Column

Social Action. The Church is never behind in dealing with social issues. Matter of fact, she does a lot of social action work

in accord with the Gospel values. Where there is need for social action, the Church is always there. There is never a lack of resource for her to be able to respond to the most pressing needs of the current time.

In every place, there is a unique social action the Church is committed to be part of. Most often she is a quick provider of resolutions to difficult political, social, economic and moral issues the community faces. At least around here, we are dealing with several pressing issues: the gender ideology, homelessness, and prolife ideologies. I know there are still plenty to mention but these three come first in the order of necessity that our local church tries to respond faithfully.

The gender ideology is moving in our communities like flowing water, swiftly and mightily. Like the good, the gender ideology is characterized by the pressing call to justice, equality and non-discrimination, all of which are deemed good. And the good named as justice, equality and non-discrimination is aligned with our Gospel values. And so the narrative of invoking and promoting the good of the people of the LGBTQIA+ confuses if not challenges the Church teachings. But along this dilemma, the Church is not only working to prevent the erosion of the upheld values but also works to aid people invoke their God given dignity. Yes, the Church does not cancel any person due to their sexual orientation or preference. But, what she does is for the upkeep of what is moral and ethical. God created them as they are. The Church leads them to rediscover their importance. The Church has special ministry to the LGBTQIA+ persons helping and guiding them to seek what makes them truly live their lives with dignity and integrity.

Courage International is one community who walks with LGBTQIA+ persons. It is available online. -30-

Acción Social. La Iglesia nunca se ha quedado atrás en el tratamiento de los asuntos sociales. De hecho, ella hace mucho trabajo de acción social de acuerdo con los valores del Evangelio. La ideología de género está goteando en nuestras comunidades como un agua que fluye, rápida y poderosamente. Al igual que los buenos, la ideología de género se caracteriza por el llamamiento urgente a la justicia, la igualdad y la no discriminación, todo lo cual se considera bueno. Y el bien llamado justicia, igualdad y no discriminación está alineado con nuestros valores evangélicos. Y así la narrativa de invocar y promover el bien de la gente de la LGBTQIA+ confunde si no desafía las enseñanzas de la Iglesia. Pero a lo largo de este dilema, la Iglesia no sólo está trabajando para prevenir la erosión de los valores defendidos, sino también para ayudar a las personas a invocar su dignidad dada por Dios.

Sí, la Iglesia no cancela a ninguna persona debido a su orientación o preferencia sexual. Pero lo que hace es, para el mantenimiento de lo moral y ético, que les lleva a redescubrir su importancia como pueblo que Dios creó tal como son. La Iglesia tiene un ministerio especial a las personas LGBTQIA+ ayudando y guiándolas a buscar lo que les hace vivir verdaderamente sus vidas con dignidad e integridad.
