Fr. Cit's Column

Faith that saves. What is faith if it is not intended to help save the heathen. I probably used a strong word. What I want to say I would like to relate to the miracle requirement for a saint to be declared a saint. In the canonization process, a candidate has to present miracles that were manifested through their intercession. These miracles are carefully scrutinized and examined of veracity pertaining to their improbability of a science-based explanation.

Miracles are God's manifestation to pad faith. Although the ideal is faith is not seeing with the eyes but believing through the eyes of faith. But these miracles provide some ground for the faithful to anchor their growing faith, and then help them to make faith a channel of salvation. These miracles cause the believer to have reason to believe and grow in faith. Let us understand that despite the intelligibility of the mind of God, he gives ways for man to grasp even in the limits of the mind, the act of God. These concrete things lead the mind to understand what is perceived through the concrete.

The Mass is the concrete God manifestation. The Mass must let the believer experience the true God in and through it. And if he does it every time he attends Mass, and he is sent to do his mission, his faith saves.

In the Mass, the miracles God acts on are plenty there is an impossible chance one might miss. On different occasions of celebrating Mass, I have seen many parishioners get very emotional. There I have seen miracles. There I have seen what miracle is authentic and what is not. There I witnessed an immutable mix of the profane and the sacred, and the sacred overpowering the profane helping those who truly seek God are led towards the light of God's salvation.
