



Prayers. Here is a testament to the power of prayer. Here in Manila, commute is not the best. Driving is equally worst. I did both. I tried commute one time, and it went uneventful, except that the commute lasted for three hours. Best case scenario, when all things are well, that commute could be done in only an hour. To use my time well, I chose to drive instead. In reality, I would have avoided it, had the commute not been a waste of time. Driving in Manila is worst. The rule is to get to the destination first. Each driver is competitive to get that goal done. The result, the traffic does not ease up.

I had not been as prayerful as now. Every time I drive on the streets of Manila, I say all the prayers I know and ask God to keep me steady and to safe and not to hurt others too.

Imagine the exact opposite when you drive relaxed. Well, I try to relax behind the wheel, but the science of this traffic consists of courage and prayer. I get nervous just making all the efforts of obeying traffic rules in the midst of thousand others who do not care.

But last Monday was the worst. I was driving Roxas Boulevard, a highway packed with cars of all sizes and number of wheels (from 2 to 10). Roxas Boulevard has four (4) [sometimes three] lanes. But I tell you what, there are not only three or four cars occupying the lanes. Four to six!

Each car makes its own lane, weaving through where there is space in order to get out first! No other rule, except the showing of the bravado!

So, just like an Oregonian driver, when I was about one mile away from the supposed right turn on Rizal Park to the direction of The Catholic Trade Manila in Tayuman, I took the right most lane. On my left was a 10-wheeler cargo truck. Huge. Imposing. Tough.

While advancing towards the right turn, I was feeling being choked. The right turn ahead of me was slowly going away from my sight, the truck on my left side instead was blocking that view. It was eating my lane. It was going to crush me. I was bullied by a thoughtless, careless driver.

Immediately, I stopped driving forward, heading to the side. Thank God, I was at an intersection.
