Fr. Cit's Column

If God was serious about leading people towards the fulfilled promise, why would Jesus choose men who were not formally

trained on the Mosaic Law?

I was trained, fit and equipped for many years, and yet feel inadequate. But the original ministers of the church were not even scholars. Why this rigorous academic training? Why this super complicated formation? What did it accomplish?

Apparently, the Church growth demanded institutions like the seminary. I am quite sure that, with the need for ministers to fill the dioceses around the world, the need for training men for the "profession" has to be done the way the norms of church and community were done. St. Charles Borromeo, consciously responding to the needs of the times, moved by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, led the Church to bring men together to be "schooled". The aim was to train men to be spiritually, emotionally, mentally and physically fit to be priests. The seminary was a development that was cumulated from what was begun before a formal school was put up by him. The purpose was to arrive at ordaining men who were, by Biblical standard, fit to ideals of the founder of the Church.

To accomplish that, the formators become responsible of consulting the people whether these men are truly ready to be called to order (ordination). You see, in the past, the community (the people) choose from their own community members the suitable man to be their presbyters. Now, they go through formation, they graduate, and they are recommended (based on assessments and consultation) for ordination by the community representatives.


I went through that rigorous and complicated process. After ordination, the process of formation continues. Otherwise, I would feel adequate and be myself my own: independent, courageous, proud. The Apostles were chosen because they were adequate with Jesus who filled them.-30-

Pero los ministros originales de la iglesia ni siquiera eran eruditos. ¿Por qué esta rigurosa formación académica? ¿Por qué esta formación súper complicada? ¿Qué logró? Al parecer, el crecimiento de la Iglesia exigía instituciones como el seminario. Estoy muy seguro de que, con la necesidad de ministros que llenen las diócesis de todo el mundo, la necesidad de capacitar a los hombres para la "profesión" tiene que hacerse de la manera en que se hicieron las normas de la iglesia y la comunidad. St Charles Borromeo, respondiendo conscientemente a las necesidades de los tiempos, movido por la inspiración del Espíritu Santo, llevó a la Iglesia a reunir a los hombres para ser "educados". El objetivo era entrenar a los hombres para que estuvieran en forma espiritual, emocional, mental y física para ser sacerdotes. El seminario fue un desarrollo que se acumuló a partir de lo que se comenzó antes de que se preparara una escuela formal por él. El propósito era llegar a ordenar a hombres que, por norma bíblica, eran aptos a la mente del fundador de la Iglesia. Para lograr eso, los formadores se vuelven responsables de consultar a la gente si estos hombres están realmente listos para ser llamados al orden (ordenación). Ves, en el pasado, la comunidad (la gente) elige de entre sus propios miembros de la comunidad al hombre adecuado para ser sus presbíteros.

Ahora, pasan por la formación, se gradúan, y son recomendados (basados en evaluaciones y consultas) para la ordenación por los representantes de la comunidad.

Pasé por ese proceso riguroso y complicado. Después de la ordenación, el proceso de formación continúa. De lo contrario, me sentiría adecuado y sería yo mismo mío: Independiente, valiente, orgulloso. Los Apóstoles fueron elegidos porque eran adecuados con Jesús que los Ilenó.–30-
