Fr. Cit's Column

The Hilltop is magical. Several of them have been part of my memory having experienced them or having thought

about them. On top of the hill is surely breathtaking. From my viewpoint, it is a crazy beauty I cannot get in my mind I have to come back many times to familiarize each piece below. But that is impossible. That is why going on top of the hill has to be done ceremoniously all throughout life. Probably I can just get enough of what to see below or probably my mind is not capable to hold them still. No matter what, the point is the top of the hill is not only a place. It is an exalted place.

You are probably familiar with the Mt. Angel Abbey. It is sitting on top of the hill of St. Benedict, or probably known to almost all, Mt Angel town. Trivia: the abbey is on St. Benedict, a town of its own, the whole hill. On this hill is a light for the local church and for the whole world. Many vocations were polished here. And many monks, priests and religious have been gifted to the world from this little hill; add in there the many men and women too whose values for Christian character were formed here and became notable citizens in many different fields of expertise, especially good role models: teachers, law enforcers, government leaders and so on.

Not to be taken out of context, the Bible talks about forms of land and water important to God's work. Used for literal or symbolic meaning, these forms of land or water are famous. Their names become household names. The Mount of Transfiguration or the Sea of Galilee for example.

The mountain or hilltop is a significant place where the Lord revealed himself as a form. When we recreate this place in our worship, we use symbolisms or concrete forms that would signify such a place. Why? To put us where God want us to be.

We call the Mass the summit of our prayer life and our Christian participation in Christ's life. On this top "place" we allow God to recreate us and help us to choose the holy.-30-
