Mardi Gras. Of all Tuesdays, this one is the most exciting. I am speaking from the perspective of the general Christian

communities. The revelry is too high there is no way partiers don't get wasted. And I mean that word wasted just as it is.

Shrove Tuesday is not a time to waste by partying. It is an important time to prepare for the coming Lenten Season. By Shrove Tuesday's celebration, we practice temperance and prudence. But I see things done against temperance and prudence. Many celebrate Shrove Tuesday as if the world ends tomorrow.

The common attitude is "Get all the joy and happiness as you can before you run out of supply." Revelers haste binging all the joy they can fill their hearts with. It is as if tomorrow, when Lent starts, they will actually cease to indulge.

The Last Supper similarly preempts days of sobriety. Jesus gathered his disciples, his closest and confidants, to share his last days with them. He threw a party. Food and wine and stories and service.

Were they wasted? They were preoccupied by the distressing news: Jesus will be tried. suffer and die on the cross. Sorrow filled their heart. They could not grasp what was to happen. They were perplexed by the events that unfolded.

While they were suffering, we were being prepared to benefit from the greatest work of mercy: salvation. Death becomes life.

The Mass celebrates that life giving death. Through the bread and wine, we recall Jesus' death on the cross, the ultimate sacrifice and none other. When we share this joy of God who gave his Son through death, we don't go wasted. We gain life.-30-

La Última Cena precede igualmente a los días de sobriedad. Jesús reunió a sus discípulos, sus más cercanos y confidentes, para compartir sus últimos días con ellos. Él lanzó una fiesta. La comida y el vino y las historias y el servicio.

¿Fueron desperdiciados? Estaban preocupados por la triste noticia: Jesús será probado. sufrirá y morirá en la cruz. El dolor llenó su corazón. No podían comprender lo que iba a suceder. Estaban perplejos por los acontecimientos que se desarrollaron.

Mientras ellos sufrían, nosotros estábamos siendo preparados para beneficiarnos de la mayor obra de misericordia: la salvación. La muerte se convierte en vida.



Excerpt from Why Ashes?

For centuries, Catholic Christians have marked the beginning of the season of Lent by receiving ash on their foreheads on Ash Wednesday. This tradition has its roots in the Old Testament, where wearing ashes was a common sign of repentance for sins, and a sign of one's humility before God. Since Lent is a season of penitential renewal through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, it's appropriate that this ancient sign marks the beginning of the season.

The Gospel for Ash Wednesday is a reminder that the real purpose of the season of Lent isn't to make public demonstrations of piety-even the wearing of ashes—but to seek conversion of heart.
