Forgive them; they know not what they do (Luke 23:34). God's mercy is a love that is extremely outside boundaries.

No one is like him. To communicate that love, Jesus, the new Adam took sin away, giving humanity new life, restoring to man the dignity that was flawed due to the fall. Forgiveness, despite the evil that was done to him, was his heart's content and desire. The true purpose of the cross was salvation. Through his death, humanity may be reconciled with God and with one another.

I am sure, hanging on the cross but offering forgiveness, he desires to free the world from the darkness of sin and death. Do we share in his desire?
