Fr. Cit's Column I thirst (Jn 19:28). Here's a haunting reality. It is either a result of a naturally scarce resource or an artificially created scarcity due to the errors of man. Water is important for life cannot exist without it. People were undoubtedly dependent on the benefits of water they built their settlements near it. They thrived. From small settlements, progress around the water grew.

In places where there is water scarcity, life is harder. Progress is slower. They have to be blessed with a useful mineral to make money and supply water from an artificial source. But for a poorer community, how do they survive? I thirst. Many of our fellowmen are thirsty for clean water. How do they thrive? This case, despite difficult, makes man tough. Life has to go on, and whatever it takes, something must be provided even if it is not the best. Jesus was given cheap wine. Like Jesus, many poor people have only "cheap wine" to survive. But they can't complain. They treasure every drop of any water they can have. Any kind of water is treasured because the quality is not as important as its purpose. Whatever is available, it is valued as though it is the priciest possession on earth. Why not? Life is most precious. Without water, life ends. Therefore, whatever kind of water is available, if life can be sustained, it is treasured. There are so many things in our communal life that are undervalued. It is a reality that is hard to swallow but it is considerably shrugged off. We do not wait till we are awakened by a reality that what we have been ignoring is at its thinnest supply. Jesus thirsts for our faith. But we are stingy. May we be inspired to love Christ. Our thirst will be guenched. -30-




