there is always this pain killer or that procedure to help the patient. There is no tolerance to pain or suffering.

I understand, pain and suffering are not welcome. They make life miserable. They make life unbearable. Life is not life without comfort and good.

Well, if you are in places where deprivation is abundant, suffering and pain are involved in their daily grind. I was in that position many years ago. But I never complained. Or probably I did but life must go on. I mean, I have to look past the suffering and be able to see the joys of having the little luxury we have. That probably was the secret why we can smile at the storm.

But that has changed. Living in comfort, with all the good things within reach, I dread suffering. I am not patient with a little pressure put on my shoulder because I feel like I do not deserve this cross.

I think I forgot the value of suffering. Easily I see suffering as nonsense, unwelcome and unimportant. I am spoiled.

When I remember that the Cross of Christ is love, I am ashamed of my inordinate attachment to the fair world. Part of that is to be influenced a lot by a culture that loves comfort so much but does not see any good from suffering.

Just going back to my childhood days, I am consoled to realize that I never had a difficulty with poverty and suffering. And then that consolation immediately becomes desolation for entertaining some blames: why was this and that not this and that? If my parents were just this, we could have been that. How pitiful I was to even question the past just because I have tasted comfort. How comfort deceives. There is only one true good: God.-30-

Cuando recuerdo que la Cruz de Cristo es amor, me avergüenzo de mi apego desmesurado al mundo justo. Parte de eso es ser influenciado mucho por una cultura que ama tanto la comodidad pero no ve nada bueno con el sufrimiento.

Volviendo a mis días de infancia, me consuela darme cuenta de que nunca tuve dificultades con la pobreza y el sufrimiento. Y entonces ese consuelo se convierte inmediatamente en desolación por albergar algunas culpas: ¿por qué esto y aquello no era esto y aquello? Si mis padres fueran solo esto, podríamos haber sido eso. Qué lamentable era incluso cuestionar el pasado solo porque he probado la comodidad. Cómo engaña la comodidad. Sólo hav un bien verdadero: Dios.-30-

## K of C SCHOLARSHIP!!!


