est reality to the love of God. Your sacrifices for your loved one is immense nothing can ever compare. We know the many nights you gave up sleep to make sure we were rested well. We know the many things you chose not to have because you made our comfort a priority. We know the many free time you wished to spend with friends or on

your leisure but you actually spent with us so you could watch us grow and assure our good future.

I just want to give spotlight to this woman I have known, and I have admired for her choices. I personally met her in the school once and then had a conversation with her through our school-office personnel as her representative.

She enrolled her only son hoping this time he would intend to study and finish school. At 22 he was beginning high school, not for the first time but many times. Fervently she pleaded to her son to take seriously this new opportunity given to him for there might not be another one. She dreamt for him a good future and she hoped that he dreams a good future for himself too. The next few months were not good. He started to be erratic. He was not always in school.

When he was in school, he did not intend to study or learn. It was for a show.

He used his Mom's vulnerability to demand for his wants. When his Mom learned he was not going to school, she pleaded with him to take seriously his studies; he asked his Mom to give him what he wants.

The poor woman was sad, but she was determined to create for her son an environment of success. She did not give up though she was aware her son's demands were abusing her weakness.

I have not known whether she was successful leading her son to the good. However, for me, what matters was the difference she made. -30-


