Fr. Cit's Column

Festival. Loud. Colorful. Abundant. Joyous. I love festivals although I am not a partygoer. I do not necessarily like parties,

but the merrymaking gives me a different boost. I just enjoy being present there, watch the revelry and feel good about the happy mood of the party and the partiers. Weird, right? I know, it makes sense that a party is fun by engaging in the revelry and fun. But there are some of us who can enjoy the revelry by not directly engaging in the revelry. I am one of them. I watch the fun until I have enough of it. Then I go home and enjoy my own peace.

I can also participate and have enough of it although I only engage to an extent those that within my comfort zone. I am not the crowd performer or the center of everyone's attention. I just cannot handle so much pressure and attention. I like it non-invasive. Thinking about the parties I attended, my memory remembers always those I attended at Tîa Nora's. Tía Nora is Mon's sister. Her family was financially comfortable. That explains why her family can spend money for parties. Since my Mom was close to the family and did a lot of household help, we were there for most, if not all the parties, she held. The parties were always big. There was always a lot of food. They were all mouthwatering varieties; these kinds of food I only ate at parties. And as a child, my favorite was a hotdog on a stick. Imagine a barbecue stick, a hotdog, a marshmallow and a slice of fruit. On the barbecue stick, the fried or grilled hotdog was the main piece. The marshmallow and the slice of fruit add flavor and color. For me, if a party had this child's favorite, the party was loud and colorful, special and joyous.

God's banquet has no hotdog on a stick. However, I am sure it is incomparable.-30-

Y cuando era niño, mi favorito era un perrito caliente en un palo. Imagina un palo de jocho: un jocho, un malvavisco y una rebanada de fruta. En el palo de barbacoa, el jocho frito o a la parrilla era la pieza principal. El malvavisco y la rodaja de fruta añaden sabor y color. Para mí, si una fiesta tenía el favorito de este niño, la fiesta era ruidosa y colorida, especial y alegre.



Rev. Fr. Carlos Piedrahita, P.S.S. will be visiting our parish next weekend to speak at all the Masses on behalf of Cross Catholic Outreach which was founded to create a meaningful link between parishes in America and the priests and nuns working in the Church overseas in the Caribbean, Africa, Asia, Central and South America.

Father Carlos Piedrahita was ordained in 2013 for the Archdiocese of Hartford, CT. He joined the Diocese of Tyler, Texas. He was born in Medellin, Colombia. Before beginning his seminary studies, Fr. Carlos earned a bachelor's degree in Business Administration and a Master's in Strategic Management of Costs and Finances at EAFIT University in Colombia. He studied Philos-

ophy at the University of St. Thomas, Houston, TX and completed a Master's in Divinity at St. John's Seminary in Brighton, MA. He is a candidate for a Sacred Theology License in Spirituality at Boston College, where he is writing his thesis on the Humanity of Christ

in the works of St. Ignatius of Loyola and St. Teresa of Avila. He also received training as a Director of Spiritual Exercises and Spiritual Director at St. Beuno's Jesuit Spirituality Centre in North Wales, United Kingdom. He has served as a parochial vicar at the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception in Waterbury, St. Paul Church and St. Augustin in Glastonbury, the Torrington Catholic Cluster, and St. Matthew Church in Forestville; as parish administrator of St. Mary Church in Newington; and as an assistant Master of Ceremonies of the Archdiocese. Fr. Piedrahita is currently a member of the faculty of Theological College, The National Seminary at The Catholic University of America in Washington, DC.
