The rise. By this time, I am in the Holy Land with the pilgrims. I know all of us wish to be here where Christ lived and

walked. Some of you probably already did. Now we (this pilgrim group) are here. Only a few of us from the parish made it here this time. If only all of us can be here in the Holy Land, how exciting would that be. But I know, by faith, that one day, we will all be in the Holy Land, in the homeland of the Father with the saints and the holy ones.

This land, a colony, was insignificant. But the Lord, magnificent in his works, made this

This land, a colony, was insignificant. But the Lord, magnificent in his works, made this small land rise. From the small town of Nazareth, the revelation of God was fulfilled, and the world is its mission: to rise from her is the new heaven and the new earth.

The Lord is the master craftsman. It is his work and the work, beyond our understanding, happens the way it should. We cooperate. We work with God. God blesses our participation in his work with graces beyond our expectation.

We know from our human experience that a rise of something results from hard work. God's work is not within that scope. However, our cooperation in that God's work requires us perseverance and hard work. But no amount of our hard work can ever change God's plan and the fulfillment of his work. The perseverance we do actually benefits us, way beyond the amount of prize we want. This explains why our successes must not make us gods. This is why our successes do not measure up to what God completes.

From the small the grand will rise. Something that we do not grasp well, although we have an understanding. I mean, our attitude towards the insignificant, obscure, non-pompous things shows we do not grasp well the God project.

Let us trust God where he works, how he works, and make ourselves available cooperators of this divine work.-30-
