Fr. Cit's Column

Upper room. We visited an upper room. That may be the actual room where Christ and his disciples held the Passover meal, but

we do not know. In it was a memorial left by Pope St. John Paul II when he visited the Holy Land. None can find any trace that this upper room was actually the upper room, except that it was an upper room that signifies proximity to all that had happened after the meal. I was expecting a reconstruction of the event. Nothing. It was just an open space filled by pilgrims. Maybe I expected way too much.

In one of the local shops, a shop attendant graciously explained to me an art: the Last Supper, not by Leonardo Davinci. He said that this interpretation of the Last Supper is closest to what had happened in the upper room. The disciples and Jesus were reclined around a ushaped table. Peter and John the Beloved were positioned at each end of the table to signify that they were the oldest (or probably referring to his role in the group) and the youngest in the group. Jesus was not in the center but seated on one side where John was.

It was an aha! moment. I thought the Last Supper was never so real to me until that lecture a local provided me on that quick conversation. This made me excited; actually it made me expect to see "something" when I visited the upper room. But the upper room was not what I expected.

Not bad though. I thought, the lecture I got two days back was enough for me to fill in the blank. My imagination helped.

In an Ignatian Spiritual exercise, a retreatant is allowed to reconstruct the Christ event or the Bible story through imagination. In the upper room, I used that technic. I placed the characters of the Last Supper in the upper room. And the story flowed like it was the day Jesus ate with his apostles, instituted the Holy Eucharist, and gave authority and commissioned his apostles to do the Eucharistic memorial always.

We continue to celebrate Jesus' memorial by our partaking of his Body and Blood at Mass. Let us strive to make our lives filled with the grace of God's love when we are nourished by this eternal food .- 30-

Piso Alto. Visitamos una habitación superior. Esa puede ser la sala real donde Cristo y sus discípulos celebraron la cena de la Pascua, pero no lo sabemos. En él había un memorial dejado por el Papa San Juan Pablo II cuando visitó Tierra Santa. Nadie puede encontrar ningún rastro de que esta sala fuera en realidad la sala, excepto que era una habitación superior que significa proximidad a todo lo que había sucedido después de la comida. Esperaba una reconstrucción del evento. Nada. Era solo un espacio abierto lleno de peregrinos. Tal vez esperaba demasiado. En una de las tiendas locales, un empleado me explicó gentilmente un arte: la Última Cena, no de Leonardo Davinci. Dijo que esta interpretación de la Última Cena es la más cercana a lo que había sucedido en la sala alta. Los discípulos y Jesús estaban reclinados alrededor de una mesa en forma de U. Pedro y Juan el Amado se colocaron en cada extremo de la mesa para significar que eran los mayores (o probablemente refiriéndose a su papel en el grupo) y los más jóvenes del grupo. Jesús no estaba en el centro, sino sentado a un lado donde estaba Juan. ¡Fue un ajá! momento. Pensé que la Última Cena nunca fue tan real para mí hasta que una conferencia que un local me proporcionó sobre esa conversación rápida. Esto me emocionó; en realidad me hizo esperar ver "algo" cuando visité la sala. Pero la sala no era lo que esperaba. Sin embargo, no está mal. Pensé, la conferencia que recibí hace dos días fue suficiente para llenar el espacio en blanco. Mi imaginación ayudó.

En un ejercicio espiritual Ignaciano, a un retiro se le permite reconstruir el evento de Cristo o la historia bíblica a través de la imaginación. En la sala alta, utilicé esa técnica. Coloqué los personajes de la Última Cena en la sala. Y la historia fluyó como si fuera el día en que Jesús comió con sus apóstoles, instituyó la Sagrada Eucaristía, y dio autoridad y comisionó a sus apóstoles para hacer el memorial eucarístico siempre.

Continuamos celebrando el memorial de Jesús participando de su Cuerpo y Sangre en la Misa. Esforcémonos por llenar nuestras vidas de la gracia del amor de Dios cuando nos alimentamos de este alimento eterno.-30-
