Fr. Cit's Column

Abouna! Arabic for "(Our) Father". The honorific name is addressed to all priests, especially the Orthodox church priests.

The name is said very respectfully the word has its meaning come alive. I mean, they call Abouna essentially not as a word said but a dictate of the heart and a custom for ages of long time ago made ever new its value has not worn out ever. Every Abouna, whoever he is, for them, he is a holy man. It is not the person, but the person he vicariously presents. It is not his status but his office (ontological personality) that they honor and revere. I made a few of the Christians in Holy Land sad. I was offered free meals. I politely declined. One was displeased. I knew, from her facial reaction, my action was not welcome. The next time we went to food house, I sat at the back away from the group, hoping they get the message that I was not there to eat. The owner insisted that I eat. He felt uncomfortable when I continued to decline. They were sad. They felt unappreciated.

As a custom, the Mediterranean people are very generous, caring and hospitable. They will feed you until you can't take anymore. They oblige as a matter of pride. It is a boost for their long held custom.

So, when I allowed to be received by Mike's family in their home, I made them really happy. Mike is my contact person for the Holy Land pilgrimage. To thank me for putting up the pilgrimage, he arranged a dinner for me. It was a warm and filling welcome. Actually, it was not only his family who was there. Some friends came too to welcome me. And by extension, wherever we go, and where their friends were, they would wear the best smile and say their warmest welcome to me and the whole group. It was a pleasant welcome. Abouna! I have never experienced to be called dearly without fail. I know what it is like as I can distinguish what's said from the heart and what's not.-30-

Cada Abouna, quienquiera que sea, para ellos, es un hombre santo. No es la persona, sino la persona que presenta vicariamente. No es su estatus sino su oficio (personalidad ontológica) lo que honran y veneran.

Entristecí a algunos de los cristianos en Tierra Santa. Me ofrecieron comidas gratis. Me negué cortésmente. Uno estaba disgustado. Sabía, por su reacción facial, que mi acción no era bienvenida. La próxima vez que fuimos a la casa de comidas, me senté en la parte de atrás lejos del grupo, esperando que recibieran el mensaje de que no estaba allí para comer. El dueño insistió en que comiera. Se sintió incómodo cuando continué declinando. Estaban tristes. Se sentían poco apreciados.

Como costumbre, los pueblos mediterráneos son muy generosos, cariñosos y hospitalarios. Te alimentarán hasta que no puedas aguantar más. Obligan por una cuestión de orgullo. Es un impulso para su costumbre de larga data.

Entonces, cuando permití ser recibido por la familia de Mike en su casa, los hice muy felices. Mike es mi persona de contacto para la peregrinación a Tierra Santa. Para agradecerme por organizar la peregrinación, organizó una cena para mí. Fue una cálida y abundante bienvenida. En realidad, no solo su familia estaba allí. Algunos amigos también vinieron a darme la bienvenida.

¡Abouna! Nunca había experimentado que me llamaran caro sin falta. Sé cómo es como puedo distinguir lo que se dice desde el corazón y lo que no.–30-


