The Colossus. A tropical Acacia stood prominently on the campus. None of the university students would speak ill about that

tree for it had created so much memories and goodwill.

The tree was a living and silent testament to every graduation, every loss or win the College of Engineering soccer team had, every University Students Council's dance, every rally, every University president sworn-in and the beginning and end of every University president's term. every group's uphill battle and joyous success at all endeavors, every student's struggles and joys in school and in life in general, even every hazing that panned out in broad day light or in the silence of early evenings by Greek-Alphabet-named fraternities. There was nothing too light or too complex that was not hospitably embraced by that magnificent tree.

I was one of those students who was witnessed by this Acacia tree since the day I walked the halls of that university. For four years, it became a witness to my start and my completion of high school. Twice it witnessed me go up on the stage to get my certificates of completion. One for high school and another for college.

Every time I have the chance to visit it, I would check how it is doing. Then lately, I went to see it. It was ground zero. There only stood a memorial of the colossal tree. It perished due to the storm of July 15, 2014. I could not believe it. How could a mighty and huge tree like it be uprooted by a weather disturbance? It was inconceivable.

I searched for news and testimonials about the tree's demise. It was harrowing to read the many sad goodbyes. To many young Bicolanos, they would not understand the reverence to

Even the mighty and the strong have an end. However, the lasting memories stay. They are praised forever. Their history will find its place intertwined with the future. It will not be gone or forgotten.



When do we celebrate St. James' feast? While the usual practice is to celebrate a saint's birth into glory (the day of death), believed to be March 25th, the Church celebrates the feast of St. James the Greater on July 25th. During the Middle Ages Santiago de Compostela in Galicia (NW Spain) had become a pilgrimage site for all of Europe, as it was here that the relics of the Apostle are kept, and it was on July 25th that they were brought out for veneration. By the 10th century, this date was the one adopted in Rome, as

What was Saint James the Greater known for? St. James was a fisherman who, with his brother John, worked in their father Zebedee's business. Together they were among the first disciples of Jesus (Mt. 4:21-

well.



## What do we know about the early life of St. James?

While we know little information regarding the early life of St. James, he was the brother of John, the beloved disciple, and probably the elder of the two. His parents seem to have been people of means as appears from the following facts. Zebedee was a fisherman of the Sea of Galilee, who probably lived in or near Bethsaida (John 1:44), perhaps in Capharnaum, which was on the lake; and had some boatmen or hired men as his usual attendants (Mark, 1, 20).

### What is the meaning of the name James?

James is the Greek form of the name of the Patriarch Jacob, in Hebrew Ya'aqob, and in Latin lacob or lacobus. In Spanish the saint's name has been rendered as Santiago, a name given to the Shrine in Galicia possessing his relics, and a given name for boys.

What was one of the unique experiences James had with Jesus?

Saint James the Greater was a witness to Jesus' Transfiguration. Jesus had His three closest apostles — Peter, James, and John — with him on a mountaintop when his body became luminous. He was joined by Moses and Elijah, who appeared with Him in glory.

#### What miracles did James witness or perform?

According to Sacred Scripture, Saint James witnessed the cure of Peter's mother-inlaw and the raising of Jarius's daughter from the dead, among other miracles. Many stories and legends attribute to James great miracles, as well, including raising the dead-a miracle not unknown in the lives of the saints, as Jesus himself promised (John 14:12).

## What led to the death of James?

St. James the Greater, having preached Christianity in Spain, returned to Judea and began again to preach and proclaim the Gospel to the Jews. Eventually he was arrested and put to death by order of King Herod, about the year 44 A.D. His body was miraculously translated to Iria Flavia in the northwest of Spain, and later to Compostela, and ultimately placed in the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela. Here his relics became the object of pilgrimage and veneration from all over Europe during the Middle Ages, and the objective of the pilgrims Way of St. James.


