Fr. Cit's Column

Moonlit evening. I have a special connection to the moon. I was a teen when I discovered love for the moon, although it was a

rare opportunity to see the moon when it is full. It only occurred once a month minus those months when the sky was dark with thick rain clouds. In my region, there were always more rainy months than clear evening skies.

I adore the shiny moonlight. When the house was dark, it was better to glimpse light from the bright moon. It gave peace and joy.

Many years, our evenings were dark. We were only brightened by a kerosene lamp. It was not enough. But I cannot complain. We could not afford to buy electricity.

The moon was a reprieve. Every time it was shining fully, my excitement could not be contained. I would set up my table outside. Or if the makeshift table outside was still good (which usually rots due to the rainy months), I would set up a burning coconut husk to drive away mosquitoes. There under the bright moonlight, I would sit for hours enjoying the bright moon-

lit night. I enjoyed completing many nights of homework, read many written works, drew many sketches, heard and sang many songs under the moonlight.

What looked like a wise use of free light (also renewable energy) turned to be a gracious adoration of the Creator. I did not realize that immediately. When we were back to the grid, I did

not need the moonlight. Oh, actually, I did not need it for my usual work accomplishments needing light. But I needed it for reprieve, the way it was back in the days (rather evenings). Consequently, that needing for reprieve made me wish the moonlight would be there always. The connection was stronger because I realized the moonlight was at my side. The moonlight made me capable when it was not easy to be so. The moonlight gave me the chance to accomplish things that would have been impossible to do in the dark.

I think that experience help me see God, my light, in his highest glory.-30-

Allí, bajo la brillante luz de la luna, me sentaba durante horas disfrutando de la brillante noche de luna. Disfruté completando muchas tareas, leí muchas obras escritas, dibujé muchos bocetos, escuché y canté muchas canciones bajo la luz de la luna.

Lo que parecía un uso sabio de la luz libre (también energía renovable) se convirtió en una adoración misericordiosa del Creador. No me di cuenta de eso inmediatamente. Cuando volvimos a la red, no necesitaba la luz de la luna. Oh, en realidad, no lo necesitaba para mis logros laborales habituales que necesitaban luz. Pero lo necesitaba para el indulto, como era en los días (más bien las noches).

## 69th Annual Pilgrimage August 15, 2023






