5) Why should Mary die if she was free from Original Sin and its stain?

Being free of Original Sin and its stain is not the same thing as being in a glorified, deathless condition.

Jesus was also free of Original Sin and its stain, but he could—and did—die.

Expressing a common view among theologians, Ludwig Ott writes:

For Mary, death, in consequence of her freedom from original sin and from personal sin, was not a consequence of punishment of sin.

However, it seems fitting that Mary's body, which was by nature mortal, should be, in conformity with that of her Divine Son, subject to the general law of death.

Fr. Cit's Column

Silence. I consider silence my comfort zone. You probably won't believe it, but I am a functioning introvert. Part of that is that I

am not spontaneous. Add into that the challenge of the English language. But on top of it, nurture. I was trained to be quiet. Or maybe that was how I learned to live given that we were seven (7) siblings. I always chose silence amidst the chaos rather than push my own agenda if only peace would be attained. Rarely did I lose peace when I keep my quiet.

I had many strikes of disquiet and restlessness. I have realized I am not made for them. So, I am going back to my comfort zone again. I can't afford to lose my own peace. It is costly. Silence is not always injustice or abuse or condonation. At one point, I thought silence was bad. They say, silence makes you a victim of injustices and abuses. Or silence makes you close your eyes to the bad while they do the evil in broad day light.

The introverts know how to handle the bad in their own way, which is quite the opposite the way the extroverts do their thing.

I tried to use the extrovert's way to settle justice and address abuses. I was not cut out for it. When I used their technique, I was touted the bad. Simply put, I have distorted the technique I ought not to use just as I have destroyed my own make up (character) believing I can abandon my ways and use a technique not familiar or even suited to me. It was always a disgrace. So, what is this introvert's way to attain peace?

One evening, and not just one random evening, but usually a common occurrence, my siblings were all immersed on their "thing" after dinner. Yes, immediately after their last bite, they would return to their corner to do their "thing". The thing is each of us had our assigned tasks to do. Since each has returned to their own corner, the assigned people to put away the dinner table were "silent". Mom started to nag. But still no one was bothered. Nervous about what was happening, I obliged, slowly taking charge of all the mess to settle the growing tension in the atmosphere. While that was happening, the table was slowly getting "cleaned". And then the quiet emerged.-30-

Silencio. Considero que el silencio es mi zona de confort. Probablemente no lo creerás, pero soy un introvertido funcional. Parte de eso es que no soy espontáneo. Añade a eso el desafío del idioma inglés. Pero además, nutrir. Fui entrenado para estar callado. O tal vez así fue como aprendí a vivir dado que éramos siete (7) hermanos. Siempre elegí el silencio en medio del caos en lugar de empujar mi propia agenda si solo se lograra la paz. Rara vez perdí la paz cuando mantengo mi silencio.

Tuve muchos golpes de inquietud e inquietud. Me he dado cuenta de que no estoy hecho para ellos. Así que voy a volver a mi zona de confort otra vez. No puedo permitirme perder mi propia paz. Es costoso. El silencio no siempre es injusticia, abuso o condonación. En un momento, pensé que el silencio es malo. Dicen: El silencio te hace víctima de injusticias y abusos. O el silencio te hace cerrar los ojos a los malos mientras ellos hacen el mal en la luz del día.

Los introvertidos saben cómo manejar el mal a su manera, aunque es todo lo contrario a la forma en que los extrovertidos hacen lo suyo.

Traté de usar la manera del extrovertido para resolver la justicia y abordar los abusos. No me cortaron para ello. Cuando usé su técnica, me promocionaron lo malo. En pocas palabras, he distorsionado la técnica que no debo usar, así como he destruido mi propio caracter (personaje) creyendo que puedo abandonar mis caminos y usar una técnica que no me es familiar o incluso adecuada para mí. Siempre fue una vergüenza.

Entonces, ¿cuál es la manera introvertida de alcanzar la paz?

Una noche, y no solo una noche al azar, sino por lo general un acontecimiento común, mis hermanos estaban todos inmersos en su "cosa" después de la cena. Sí, inmediatamente después de su última mordida, regresaban a su esquina para hacer su "cosa". La cosa es que cada uno de nosotros tiene nuestras tareas asignadas para hacer.





1) What is the Assumption of Mary?

The Assumption of Mary is the teaching that:

The Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory [Pius XII, Munificentissimus Deus 44]. 2) What level of authority does this teaching have?

This teaching was infallibly defined by Pope Pius XII on Nov. 1, 1950 in the bull Munificentissimus Deus (Latin, "Most Bountiful God").

As Pius XII explained, this is "a divinely revealed dogma" (ibid.).

This means that it is a dogma in the proper sense. It is thus a matter of faith that has been divinely revealed by God and that has been infallibly proposed by the Magisterium of the Church as such. 3) Does that mean it is an "ex cathedra" statement and that we have to believe it?

Yes. Since it is a dogma defined by the pope (rather than by an ecumenical council, for example), it is also an "ex cathedra" statement (one delivered "from the chair" of Peter).

Because it is infallibly defined, it calls for the definitive assent of the faithful.

Pope John Paul II explained:

The definition of the dogma, in conformity with the universal faith of the People of God, definitively excludes every doubt and calls for the express assent of all Christians [General Audience, July 2, 1997].

Note that all infallibly defined teachings are things we are obliged to believe, even if they aren't defined "ex cathedra" (by the pope acting on his own).

The bishops of the world teaching in union with the pope (either in an ecumenical council or otherwise) can also infallibly define matters, but these aren't called "ex cathedra" since that term refers specifically to the exercise of the pope's authority as the successor of St. Peter. (It's Peter's cathedra or "chair" that symbolizes the pope's authority.)

4) Does the dogma require us to believe that Mary died?

It is the common teaching that Mary did die. In his work, Fundamentals of Catholic Dogma, Ludwig Ott lists this teaching as sententia communior (Latin, "the more common opinion").

Although it is the common understanding of that Mary did die, and although her death is referred to in some of the sources Pius XII cited in Munificentissimus Deus, he deliberately refrained from defining this as a truth of the faith.

John Paul II noted:

On 1 November 1950, in defining the dogma of the Assumption, Pius XII avoided using the term "resurrection" and did not take a position on the question of the Blessed Virgin's death as a truth of faith.




