Fr. Cit's Column

Care. Among the labor force exported around the world, skilled workers are at the top of the list statistically. They are men and women who work in various fields like domestic help, hospitality care, and nursing care. Other workers are construction, machine and transportation, factory and so on. In summary, the need is basically to fill the growing demand for private and public up-keep. Advanced economies are challenged to find these services locally, and finding that the resources are depleted due to their resources exhausted on other things, they look for supplies elsewhere, in economies where their skilled workers are still high and overflowing.

Care is not a commodity. It is natural human capacity no one should long for it or source from outside. However, the domestic setting has forged a care service to become a labor need. And it has become one in demand importer of labor force from all around the globe, skilled women, learned from their own homes, to share care, attention, love, patience and all their personal skills leaving their loved ones back home deprived of those care services in exchange of some dollars. Some see it as a win-win situation, quid-pro-quo. What they do not know is the estrangement by the people left at home. That has no price or dollar-value.

They get dollars back home. They have their fill. But they are estranged. And they manifest all the time and very specially during those times that would memorialize happy times like birthdays, Christmases, graduations and the like.

And then looking at it from the side of the receiver of care, the service remunerated by money is not always work, but actually becomes act of love. Why not? For service of love is a vocation. Those who give, they become free. Their care cannot be calculated by every dollar in exchange. Lucky are those who are treated like family, not just domestic helpers, caregivers or hospitality people. -30

Cuidado. Entre la fuerza laboral exportada a todo el mundo, los trabajadores calificados están en la parte superior de la lista estadísticamente. Son hombres y mujeres que trabajan en diversos campos como el servicio doméstico, la atención hotelera y la atención de enfermería. Otros trabajadores son la construcción, la maquinaria y el transporte, la fábrica, etc. En resumen, la necesidad es básicamente satisfacer la creciente demanda de mantenimiento privado y público. Las economías avanzadas se enfrentan al reto de encontrar estos servicios a nivel local, y al descubrir que los recursos se agotan debido a que sus recursos se agotan en otras cosas, buscan suministros en algún lugar, en economías donde sus trabajadores calificados todavía son altos y desbordantes.

El cuidado no es una mercancía. Es una capacidad humana natural, nadie debería anhelarla ni obtener de fuera. Sin embargo, el ámbito doméstico ha forjado un servicio de cuidados para convertirse en una necesidad laboral. Y se ha convertido en uno de los importadores más demandados de mano de obra de todo el mundo, mujeres cualificadas, aprendidas desde sus propios hogares, a compartir el cuidado, la atención, el amor, la paciencia y todas sus habilidades personales, dejando a sus seres queridos en casa privados de esos servicios de cuidado a cambio de algunos dólares. Algunos lo ven como una situación en la que todos ganan, quid-pro-quo. Lo que no saben es el alejamiento de las personas que se quedaron en casa. Eso no tiene precio ni valor en dólares.

Reciben dólares en casa. Tienen su saciedad. Pero están distanciados. Y se manifiestan todo el tiempo y muy especialmente durante aquellos momentos que conmemorarían momentos felices como cumpleaños, Navidades, graduaciones y similares. Y luego, viéndolo desde el punto de vista del receptor del cuidado, el servicio remunerado con dinero no siempre es trabajo, sino que en realidad se convierte en un acto de amor. ¿Por qué no? Porque el servicio de amor es una vocación. Los que dan, se vuelven libres. Su cuidado no se puede calcular por cada dólar a cambio. Afortunados son aquellos que son tratados como familia, no solo como empleados domésticos, cuidadores o personas de hospitalidad.-30-
