when the skies break open dumping tons of water from above. Imagine a huge falls, the water from above falls from the top down with all its force. I think the folks calling the downpour 'broken sky' is accurate. I saw it again this past March. One early morning, I woke up to enjoy the morning sun from our window. As soon as I shoved the curtain to the side, I saw a brewing storm. It was dark cumulus cloud covering the skies. It was going to rain. And no sooner than I turned my back away from the window that the rain poured like the skies broke open. I went to the porch to be mesmerized by the water dropping on the ground. The drops of water were heavy and huge, the rain was pouring only for couple of minutes the ground was already streaming wet.

When we were young, we sneaked out to play in the rain. There were many rainy days 13 that I could have enjoyed playing in the rain, but I could only count a couple of success-14 ful times running away from our parents' eyes. My eyes knew how to compensate. So, 15 on that day, my eyes were fixed on the dropping rain from the broken sky enjoying the rhythmic rain reminiscing my childhood. Then all of a sudden, I remembered to sneak 17 out and play in the rain. But as soon as I ran outside to enjoy the drops of water than the rain ceased pouring. I was dismayed. I did not stop looking to the sky wishing the clouds brew new rain. It did not come again during my stay. It was a missed opportuni-

ty. This Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, we do not miss any opportunity to be engaged in the life of God. He is seated at the right hand of the Father and will be returning at the appointed time. The time in between is a wait, not to be stagnant, but to actively pursue our Christian vocation to be holy. -30-

Las gotas de agua eran pesadas y enormes, la lluvia estaba derramando solo por un par de minutos el suelo ya estaba fluyendo mojado.

Cuando éramos jóvenes, nos escabullamos a jugar bajo la lluvia. Hubo muchos días Iluviosos que pude haber disfrutado jugando bajo la lluvia, pero solo pude contar un par de veces exitosas huyendo de los ojos de nuestros padres. Mis ojos sabían cómo compensar. Entonces, ese día, mis ojos estaban fijos en la lluvia que caía del cielo roto disfrutando de la lluvia rítmica que recordaba mi infancia. Entonces, de repente, me acordé de escabullirme y jugar bajo la lluvia. Pero tan pronto como he corrido afuera para disfrutar de las gotas de agua, la lluvia dejó de derramarse. Estaba consternado. No paré de esperar mirando al cielo deseando que las nubes empaparan nueva lluvia. No llegó durante mi estancia. Fue una oportunidad perdida. En esta solemnidad de la Ascensión del Señor, no perdemos ninguna oportunidad de comprometernos en la vida de Dios. Está sentado a la diestra del Padre y regresará a la hora señalada. El tiempo intermedio es una espera, no para estancarse, sino para perseguir activamente nuestra vocación cristiana de ser santos.-30-
