recollection of a hilarious experience during our Holy Land Pilgrimage. I hope that this story will engender respect and understanding. And let us not forget to pray for the Holy Land, for end to the war and for the rebirth of peace.

On the later days of our 10-day Holy Land pilgrimage, our pilgrims were craving for American food. Burger. McDonalds. Or something that's Americanly familiar. I heard some of them sneaked out to get burger from a local burger stand. The curious ones asked how their burgers tasted. They said they were really pleased. Their burgers tasted better than the burgers they had before. They even compared the burger they had to some of the best burgers in USA.

After so many meals eating Falafel and shawarma, they remembered how great burgers are. Most of them were already pleading for mercy, to give them at least a chance to satisfy their cravings for a BLT or cheeseburger, something that will relieve them from the daily

I observed their "tiredness" eating their meals they could not wait for the day of their 'freedom". And on that note they noticed me. They realized I was not bearing their burden because I was not eating lunch. One of them enthused, "Father, I will pay for your lunch. Share the cross with us." In fact, I do not need to pay for my meals because the priests are given free meals. They thought I was intentionally skipping lunch to avoid eating the unfamiliar food. I was only following a daily habit. Nevertheless, I regret my shortsightedness and imprudence.

I am thinking proactively about food culture. There is so much richness of truth that dining local food can provide. Even in our parish, we have used food and community gathering to reach out to each other and understand each one's uniqueness.—30-

En los últimos días de nuestra peregrinación de 10 días a Tierra Santa, nuestros peregrinos anhelaban comida estadounidense. Hamburguesa. McDonalds. O algo que sea familiar en Estados Unidos. Escuché que algunos de ellos se escabulleron para comprar hamburguesas en un puesto de hamburguesas local. Los curiosos preguntaron cómo sabían sus hamburguesas. Dijeron que estaban muy contentos. Sus hamburguesas sabían mejor que las hamburguesas que tenían antes. Incluso compararon la hamburguesa que tenían con algunas de las mejores hamburguesas de Estados Unidos.

Después de tantas comidas comiendo falafel y shawarma, recordaron lo geniales que son las hamburguesas. La mayoría de ellos ya estaban suplicando clemencia, para darles al menos la oportunidad de satisfacer sus antojos de un BLT o una hamburguesa con queso, algo que los aliviará de la comida diaria de un paladar desconocido.

Observé su "cansancio" comiendo sus comidas, no podían esperar el día de su "libertad". Y en ese sentido se fijaron en mí. Se dieron cuenta de que no estaba llevando su carga porque no estaba almorzando. Uno de ellos dijo entusiasmado: "Padre, pagaré tu almuerzo. Comparte la cruz con nosotros". De hecho, no necesito pagar por mis comidas porque a los sacerdotes se les da comida gratis. Pensaron que me estaba saltando el almuerzo intencionalmente para evitar comer la comida desconocida. Solo estaba siguiendo un hábito diario. Sin embargo, lamento mi miopía e imprudencia.

Estoy pensando de manera proactiva en la cultura alimentaria. Hay tanta riqueza de verdad que la comida local puede proporcionar. Incluso en nuestra parroquia, hemos utilizado la comida y la reunión comunitaria para acercarnos unos a otros y comprender la singularidad de cada uno.-30-

Please note this little change: Write your donation to St. James Church, then under memo, write St. Vincent or Senior Center as the case may be.


The business manager will write a check of all collected donations for St. Vincent or Senior Center after each collection week.
