Fr. Cit's Column


Caricature of an itinerant preacher. Sandals on their feet, a walking stick and only a tunic are their only posses-

sions, but they have the whole world at their disposal. They were sent to the peoples on all corners of the world to announce the Good News.

When I was born and brought to the Church, parishes were already established in main cities of the Philippines. Even those who belong to mendicant orders have their properties and are secured they do not have to beg. In other words, time has changed these supposed itinerant missionaries are itinerant only by virtue of being sent everywhere not of their will but God's. They too live the evangelical counsels. It may be quite challenging to be poor when the community has plenty, or obedient when they are sent off to a mission without qualms despite their given freedom to choose, and to live chaste when the world offers right on their fingertips various ways to enjoy and satisfy the needs of the flesh. Those who are called to be Christ's missionaries live "in the world in a manner that projects they are not of this world" (see John 17:16).

I met Msgr, Noe de los Santos back in 2003, though I had already heard about this saintly man even before I met him. It was that year when I joined the college seminary in the Diocese of Legazpi and Msgr. Noe has just completed a year after retiring. He stayed in the seminary being a resident, without any official duty, to thank his long years of excellent leadership as seminary rector.

Apart from his accolades, he is the humblest, poorest and holiest of the priests in the seminary. Comparably his bedroom is the most modest. Without any furniture but a study table and a study desk, bookshelves filled with probably thousands of books, and his pillow, blanket and mattress rolled and tucked on the far end corner of the room, he is complete. He uses only 2 sets of clerical garbs and 7 shirts and a pair of pants and shoes. He lives poor but he is rich he has everything, he does not have to have a thing as a possession. -

Conocí a Mons. Noé de los Santos en 2003, aunque ya había oído hablar de este hombre santo incluso antes de conocerlo. Fue ese año cuando entré en el seminario universitario de la diócesis de Legazpi y Mons. Noé acaba de cumplir un año después de jubilarse. Permaneció en el seminario siendo residente, sin ningún deber oficial, en honor a sus largos años de excelente liderazgo como rector del seminario.

Aparte de sus reconocimientos, es el más humilde, el más pobre y el más santo de los sacerdotes del seminario. Comparativamente, su dormitorio es el más modesto. Sin más muebles que una mesa de estudio y un escritorio de estudio, estanterías llenas de probablemente miles de libros, y su almohada, manta y colchón enrollados y metidos en la esquina más aleiada de la habitación, está completo. Usa solo 2 atuendos clericales y 7 camisas y un par de pantalones y zapatos. Vive pobre pero es rico, lo tiene todo, no tiene por qué tener una cosa como posesión.-30-


