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Fr. Cit's Column

Bridges. The cross is a bridge sinners must walk on to get to heaven. It is not possible for a sinner to save him-

self. Through faith in Jesus, he is saved. For faith alone traditions, believers maintain that the cross of Christ is enough, thus once saved, always saved. For Catholics, the cross is a once and for all act of salvation by God for his people called to be New Israel. While the believer cannot change that saving act, obviously faith is action, in that the believer accepts Christ and perseveres in transformation. That journey to the day appointed by God is dotted with 'crosses', a participation of a persevering believer in the salvific work of God. Not that through our acts we change our state, but through God's act of saving, the grace helps us to be transformed in accord with the vision of heaven, not of hell.

If we have been saved and have to do nothing but wait for the coming justification, then why would there be a need for each of us to be tested and tempted by sin? If already saved, would that mean we can enter the gate of heaven with baggage? If your eye makes you sin, pluck it out. Better for you to enter heaven with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown to fiery Gehenna (Mt 18:9).

The journey, if it is rightly so, might not be easy, but God provides us a lot of help to make our faith journey truly transformative. The sacramentals and the saints of God are some of these means God provides us for our benefit. When we talk about grace, we cannot understand it without these signs and sacramentals. They, again like a bridge, take us to the reality of what grace looks like. In that case, the saints who were sinners in their past changed because of God's love. They were made saints by love. How can a sinner turn down the act of love by Jesus dying on the cross?-30-

Solo por la fe en las tradiciones, los creventes saben y sostienen que la cruz de Cristo es suficiente, por lo tanto, una vez salvado, siempre salvado. Para los católicos, la cruz es un acto de salvación de una vez por todas por parte de Dios para su pueblo llamado a ser el Nuevo Israel. Si bien el creyente no puede cambiar ese acto salvador, obviamente la fe es acción, en el sentido de que el creyente acepta a Cristo y persevera en la transformación. Ese camino hasta el día señalado por Dios está salpicado de "cruces", la participación de un creyente perseverante en la obra salvífica de Dios. No es que a través de sus actos cambie su estado, sino a través del acto de salvación de Dios, la gracia le ayuda a ser transformado de acuerdo con la visión del cielo, no del infierno.

Si hemos sido salvos y no tenemos que hacer nada más que esperar la justificación venidera, entonces, ¿por qué habría necesidad de que cada uno de nosotros sea probado y tentado por el pecado? Si ya somos salvos, ¿significaría eso que podemos entrar por la puerta del cielo con un equipaje? Si tu ojo te hace pecar, sácalo. Mejor para ti entrar en el cielo con un solo ojo que con dos ojos para ser arrojado al fuego del Gehena (Mt 18:9).

El viaje, si es un viaje, puede que no sea fácil, pero Dios nos proporciona mucha ayuda para que nuestro camino de fe sea verdaderamente transformador. Los sacramentales y los santos de Dios son algunos de estos medios que Dios nos proporciona para nuestro beneficio. Cuando hablamos de gracia, no podemos entenderla sin estos signos y sacramentales. Ellos, de nuevo como un puente, nos llevan a la realidad de lo que es la gracia. En ese caso, los santos que fueron pecadores en su pasado cambiaron debido al amor de Dios. Fueron hechos santos por amor. ¿Cómo puede un pecador rechazar el acto de amor muriendo en la cruz?-30-



July 25 is our Parish Patronal Feast Day, the Feast of St. James the Greater, also the anniversary of the dedication of our parish church back in 1962. Join us for Mass at 9:00AM.

Nothing is known of St. James the Greater's early life, though it has been established that he is the son of Zebedee and Salome and brother of John the disciple.

The title "the Greater" was added to St. James' name to help distinguish him from the Apostle James "the Less," who is believed to have been shorter than James "the Greater."

Saint James the Greater was one of Jesus' first disciples. James was fishing with his father and John the Apostle when Jesus came to the shores of the Sea of Galilee and called for the fisherman, who were unable to catch any fish that day, to dip their nets in the water once again.

When the fishermen followed Jesus' instructions, they found their nets full, and after emptying the fish on board, the boats nearly sank from their weight. Later, James was one of only three called by Jesus to witness his Transfiguration, and when he and his brother wanted to call fire upon a Samaritan town, both were rebuked by Jesus.

Following Christ's Ascension, James spread the Gospel across Israel and the Roman kingdom as well. He traveled and spread the Word for nearly forty years in Spain.

It is said that one day, as he prayed, The Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to him and asked him to build her a church, which he did.

Later, James returned to Jerusalem but was martyred for his faith by King Herod, who decapitated him. Saint James the Greater is known as the first apostle to die.

As he was not allowed to be buried following his martyrdom, his remains were taken to Compostela, Spain, by some of his followers, who buried him.

In the ninth century his remains were discovered and moved to a tomb in Santiago de Compostela. Today, his remains can still be found in the Cathedral of Santiago.

Because Santiago de Compostela is the most frequently visited place pilgrims migrate to following Rome and Jerusalem, Pope Leo declared it a shrine.

O glorious Apostle,

St. James, who by reason of thy fervent and generous heart was chosen by Jesus to be a witness of His glory on Mount Tabor, and of His agony in Gethsemane:

thou, whose very name is a symbol of warfare and victory: obtain for us strength and consolation in the unending warfare of this life, that, having constantly and generously followed Jesus.

we may be victors in the strife and deserve to receive the victor's crown in heaven.
