

always doing things with one accord. Are they united? We can assume that. Now imagine a whole ensemble of music pieces in an orchestra. Each one plays a big or small part, and a melodious music is produced by it. Is it united? Unity according to the Letter to the Ephesians is outside looking in. What appears out-JULY-AUGUST side is deep inside a reality translated as calm, peace, order. Imagine the abysmal chaos hovering around. Then contrast that with the peace of the Creator God. Genesis tells us that God was in the midst of chaos. He was peace and he was sharing that peace bringing order to the elements, thereby separating the water and the dry land, and the water above the dry land. The unity within God produces order outside him. It is a power that impacts the things surrounding him because it gathers. For example, when Jesus started public ministry, the ears of those who were listening to him were captivated. He was praised because he was teaching none of the kind of synagogue leaders do. He was teaching with authority. The effect of which is gathering. He drew to himself many followers as well as opponents.

> God continues to gather his people. You would think that his power is not that strong given the continued drifting off of many people called to unity. As we observe in our society, many have preferred to unite themselves outside of the power of God. They might not be seen physically or spiritually gathered with God, but that does not mean that God does not gather them. In fact, even if the reality seems to be that they are not part of the fold, they cannot change the fact that they are God's creation, and to him they will all return. Then he will separate the goats from the sheep.-30-


