Faith that works. Where is the Church during this and that need? I have seen comments like this challenging the

Catholic Church to be proactive where she is needed, manifesting Christ's love and care for people especially the poor and needy. The reply is easy. The Catholic Church is never silent or evasive during these situations. In fact, she is the largest charitable institution the whole world over doing the most helpful to the needy and disadvantaged. She never sleeps on her pastoral responsibilities and social welfare missions.

Now, however, there is more to Christian living than just helping the needy. Christian faith that works means Christians do the most good by being themselves salt and light of the earth. Meaning, today more than ever, the world needs people who are not just capable but people who have the heart and reason like Christ.

In other words, as Christians, we have to actually commit ourselves to a life focused on imitating the values of Christ. Christianity is a way of life. By being Christian, a baptized thinks and acts like Christ.

A faith that works, as St. Paul put it is service. However we are called, we give ourselves to the community fully giving to the heart of Christian faith: conversion-from the broken to the restored.

We cannot be restorers if we do not acknowledge our own need for healing and restoration.

Christ restored the broken. We are restored by Christ and became his new creation through baptism. And the restoration continues as we go forward to the new day when God completes his program of newness.

Faith that works is always a participation in the redemptive work of God. When Christ embraced our sins, the Cross became our way towards newness. When we meet each other where we are, that is, in our ups and downs, we love no matter what. We lead everybody towards the healing power of God. No judgment. Only empathy, compassion and charity.—30-

En otras palabras, como cristianos, tenemos que comprometernos realmente a una vida centrada en imitar los valores de Cristo. El cristianismo es una forma de vida. Al ser cristiano, un bautizado piensa y actúa como Cristo.

Una fe que funciona, como dijo San Pablo, es el servicio. Cualquiera que sea el llamado, nos entregamos a la comunidad entregando plenamente el corazón de la fe cristiana: la conversión, de los quebrantados a los restaurados.

No podemos ser restauradores si no reconocemos nuestra propia necesidad de sanación y restauración.

Cristo restauró a los quebrantados. Somos restaurados por Cristo y nos convertimos en su nueva creación a través del bautismo. Y la restauración continúa a medida que avanzamos hacia el nuevo día en que Dios completa su programa de novedad.

La fe que obra es siempre una participación en la obra redentora de Dios. Cuando Cristo abrazó nuestros pecados, la cruz se convirtió en nuestro camino hacia la novedad. Cuando nos encontramos donde estamos, es decir, en nuestros altibajos, amamos pase lo que pase. Guiamos a todos hacia el poder sanador de Dios. Sin juicio. Solo empatía, compasión y caridad.-30-




