In disappointment for a work unceremoniously done, the boss shouted at her: "Tanga ka ba?" (Are you a moron?) The maid loses her confidence, tries to redeem herself from that blunder, but fails to draw her success.

I know these words are unkind and must be decommissioned. But I had my own share of being called these adjectives for the dynamics of those times enabled them. Whether it was home or school, these words were a staple. If there was a use to any of these, it was the intention of developing a resilient spirit in a trainee the way an eaglet is trained by the eagle.




