Fr. Cit's Column

World Mission Sunday. It is timely that this weekend, the World Mission Sunday, we are visited by Fr. Alliston Fernandez, a priest from India, who provides his priestly office for the work of the International Catholic Program for Evangelization (ICPE). ICPE is an international community of faithfuls coming from various backgrounds living faith in the world whose goal is to promote a dynamic Christian value formation and practice, and to enliven the Gospel call to be salt and light of the world.

World Mission Sunday is a Sunday set apart for the church to commit to her missionary work anew with the vision of continuing what was started at the inception of the community of believers bringing the Good News to all the corners of the world. Pope Francis calls all of us to either directly or indirectly be involved in the aforementioned vision by supporting the work of the Missio (Pontifical World Organization that promotes the missionary work of the Church in the world).

ICPE directly involves in that mission work. By supporting ICPE's work, we participate in the Church's missionary work and vision. I thank you for your hospitality to Fr. Alliston. I thank you for supporting World Mission Sunday.

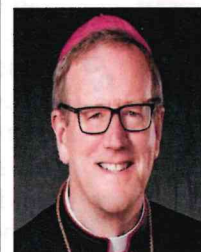

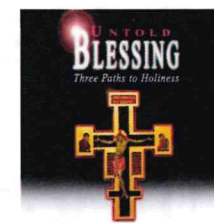

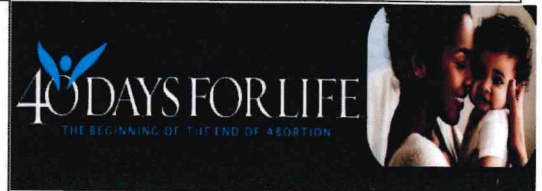
