Fr. Cit's Column

The birth of John is historical. It is not just a "once upon a time" narrative like some fictitious stories of deities and

creatures of power and magic. John's birth is placed in history when the rulers of the Roman Empire and the princes of the Kingdoms of Judah ruled between 9BC to 39 AD. Placing John's birth in human history means John's story and his ministry is true and can be verified by historical facts.

John the Baptist is a gift. In their old age, Elizabeth and Zechariah conceived John. His birth is filled with extraordinary signs the boy is thought to be "great". Filled with the Spirit, he called the people to a baptism of repentance. "Prepare the way of the Lord! Make straight his paths!"

Some of the historical proofs to verify John the Baptist's existence are the places where he lived, where he did his ministry and the impact of his ministry in the history of the times past and today. The river Jordan, for example, is constantly visited by pilgrims and tourists, seeing, and sometimes recreating the baptism John did. I suppose, those who come to recreate that baptism ministry of John are also re-enkindling their own baptism, and hopefully being so moved by the Spirit commit their lives to their

John the Baptist's water baptism is a call to cleanse one's passion from the evils and errors known to men during that time to become blameless before the Lord. The call is an imperative that was misconstrued for a puritan movement. The Essenes, from which John the Baptist is identified with, basically is a religious puritan group whose life is lived contrary to the common and the normal. By stripping their life off the comfort of the world, they make their heart free to receive the Messiah.

When John preached baptism of repentance, he attracted people who are convinced that to turn their life around (away from the sins of the world) is necessary.-30-



El nacimiento de Juan es histórico. No es solo "Érase una vez" como algunas historias ficticias de deidades y criaturas de poder y magia. El nacimiento de Juan se coloca en la historia cuando los gobernantes del Imperio Romano y los príncipes de los reinos de Judá gobernaron entre el 9a.C. y el 39 d.C. Colocando el nacimiento de John en. La historia humana significa que la historia de Juan y su ministerio son verdaderos y pueden ser verificados por hechos históricos.

Juan el Bautista es un regalo. En su vejez, Isabel y Zacarías concibieron a Juan. Su nacimiento está lleno de signos extraordinarios que se cree que el niño es "grande". Lleno del Espíritu, llamó a la gente a un bautismo de arrepentimiento. "¡Preparad el camino del Señor! ¡Haz recto sus caminos!"

Algunas de las pruebas históricas para verificar la existencia de Juan el Bautista son los lugares donde vivió, donde hizo su ministerio y el impacto de su ministerio en la historia de los tiempos pasados y hoy. El río Jordán, por ejemplo, es constantemente visitado por peregrinos y turistas, viendo, y a veces recreando el bautismo que hizo Juan. Supongo que aquellos que vienen a recrear ese ministerio del bautismo de Juan también están reavivando su propio bautismo, y con suerte, siendo tan movidos por el Espíritu, comprometen sus vidas a su bautismo.

El bautismo en agua de Juan el Bautista es un llamado a limpiar la pasión de los males y errores conocidos por los hombres durante ese tiempo para volverse irreprensible ante el Señor. El llamado es un imperativo que muchos malinterpretaron para un movimiento que es puritano. Los Esenios, de los que se identifica Juan el Bautista, son básicamente un grupo religioso puritano cuya vida se vive contrariamente a lo común y lo normal. Al despojar su vida de la comodidad del mundo, hacen que su corazón sea libre para recibir al Mesías.

Cuando Juan predicó el bautismo del arrepentimiento, atrajo a personas que están convencidas de que es necesario cambiar su vida de los pecados del mundo.-30-


