

Gaudete Sunday is the third Sunday of Advent, and is a day of joy and anticipation for the Christmas celebration. The name comes from the Latin word gaudete, which means "rejoice". The day's theme is reflected in the opening words of the introit antiphon, "Rejoice (Gaudete) in the Lord always". The focus of Advent shifts from "The Lord is coming" to "The Lord is near". The readings focus on rejoicing in the Lord and the mission of St. John the Baptist. Gaudete Sunday can fall on any date from December 11 to December 17.











VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

<u>Visiting the Homebound:</u> Making visits to people who cannot get to Mass is a special ministry. It involves a social time for many and a chance to pray with and for the needs of that person. Religious Education: We always need good people to teach our children about the Catholic Faith and to prepare them for receiving the Sacraments.
