Fr. Cit's Column The anatomy of a saint. A halo. Hands folded in prayer. A saint's garb. An image of the Bible, or church or the

Christ. In simple terms, a saint is an image of holiness!

I am positive that every day we meet a saint. Either that saint is one closest to you or a stranger, there is always that one person who will make us experience the presence of God through their love, through their beautiful values (character).

When the church was born, a cult that remembers the life of a faithful Christian makes a saint. People gather in honor of the Christian hero. The cult around the saint grows and becomes acclaimed locally and then later more extensively until it becomes a universally celebrated feast.

I mean, people who knew the virtues of the saint are essentially the basis why a saint is known. In this case, we (the Church) elevate a Christian hero to sainthood through

the process of canonization.

We never have a scarcity. There are many who are saints. No, I am not referring to the image anymore, but the real saint in action. They are the ones who actually live

the Christian virtues perseveringly and faithfully.

A mother of adults, she always prays for her children, especially those she wishes to be attending Church regularly. She is concerned that her married children are not actively living their faith, her grandchildren included. One time, she asked me if she can ask her grandchildren to be baptized. Aware of the spiritual needs of her grandchildren being left out by their parents, she wants to take the matter into her hands. Like St. Monica, to whom she prays for intercession, she does not tire to pray for her children and grandchildren. She is hopeful that one day, they will be doing her favor,
