Fr. Cit's Column Jesus preached and taught with authority. Did everybody, who heard his message, believe?

No. Just plain no. Immediately Jesus was opposed. They thought he was a lunatic, a belligerent radical, a delinquent social activist. They kept an eye on him watching that he might do something to accuse him. And they did.

If only everybody were to believe...that must be heaven, right? No pun intended. JANUARY But the true nature of revelation is a challenge to men. Again, no pun intended. They say, our mind can also grasp so little very often things that are beyond us are the hardest to adhere to. In this age, we obviously see that what is measurable, verifia-

19 ble, and tested can be categorized as truth. The things of God are not true because they cannot be verified by the exact science.

The astrologers followed a star. From what they believed to be a revelation of a longforetold virgin birth, they saw a star on its rising and they followed it. The star stood

still where the baby was born. They found his mother and father too. The angels were singing praises to the glory of God. They prostrated before the newborn King and gift-

23 ed him gold, frankincense and myrrh.

The previous week, the faithful of Manila, Philippines showed a great testament to faith. Every 9th of January, devotees to the Black Nazarene gather in a situation that can be likened to a packed can of sardines where, this year, some eight (8) million people joined the procession. Grief comes to us in many forms: the death of a spouse, child, parent or other loved one, or other significant losses, like a job, a marriage or other relationships. While there are many good psychological resources to help deal with the emotional turmoil that these losses let loose inside of us, how might we deal with our spirituality, our understanding of and relationship to God?
