Fr. Cit's Column

Heavenly people of God. According to St. Paul, we are heavenly citizens. We are temporary residents on earth. Our per-

manent residence is heaven; we are citizens of heaven.

The revelation of God's "face" is necessary and must be accepted by his people, and lived while still on earth, until the day of Jesus' coming again to judge heaven and earth. And when we are let 'in', we share the glorified body of Christ. We become the heavenly people of God.

To know God and to strive to live his heavenly example are essential if we desire to share in the eternal life with God and his saints and holy ones in heaven.

Sin prevents that heavenly inheritance. Jesus, the revelation of the Father in heaven, leads us back to our heavenly inheritance. By his sufferings, benefiting our heavenly inheritance, we are forgiven of our debts, and therefore, we are mercifully rescued for

The divine act (of love and mercy) is essential for our redemption is always at the center of our heavenly inheritance claim. Christ redeemed it for us. He ransomed us by his

death on the cross. By our acceptance of the divine mercy, we are forgiven of our sins, and we are reinvested of our old dignity as sons and daughters of God.

Forgiveness is a divine act. Acceptance of God's mercy is human cooperation to the di-

vine act. Although the mercy of God is free; it is a gift for anyone's taking, no one is

forced outside their free will to accept it. Every person is invited to either accept or reject his free gift.

Jesus place before his disciples a child and describes to them that heaven belongs to one such as this, referring to a childlike fervor and dependence to the love and mercy of God. In contrast, the heavenly face of God is not revealed to the learned and the authoritative people of Jesus' time.-30-


