Fr. Cit's Column

Spring. Time for seed growing. I was asked lately if we will grow seeds. I was mentally aware it is spring but not quite under-

standing that it is actually spring. The cold breeze lingers. The soil must still be asleep and not ready for seeds.

It is always plant season in the Philippines. Though we follow a season of planting, the soil is always ready for any seed. But for the sake of the soil nutrients and fruit bearing season, planting follows a crop cycle. For example, to be assured of good harvest for sweet potatoes, we will plant in May and harvest in October. To have a new batch of sweet potatoes, planting can be done in September and harvest in February. Sweet potatoes need the rain as well as enough sun. During these months, sweet potatoes grow and harvest well.

This crop season in the northern hemisphere is always a surprise for me. I need to study it deliberately because missing the right crop days means poor harvest. And that is what we had last year. We exhausted the soil's nutrients for nothing.

Nevertheless, springtime is always fun. It is a time to start anew. There is new life. There is new hope. New beginnings, new hopes, new expectations.

Do you know that Easter is timed in spring when the first full moon rises? Why is that? Notice that Easter is a movable feast as opposed to the December 25th nativity. When the first Council of Nicaea established that calculation of the date of Easter, in it is the consideration of the richness of the celebration. The full moon. The Vernal equinox, The significance of this season. Note that resurrection is the springtime of a new and everlasting life. After the dead winter, life springs at the onset of the warmer days. Beautiful flowers bloom. The fruiting season commences.

11 Primavera. Tiempo para el cultivo de semillas. Recientemente me preguntaron si cultivaremos semillas. Estaba mentalmente consciente de que era primavera, pero no entendía muy bien que en realidad era primavera. La brisa fría persiste. El suelo aún debe estar dormido y no listo para las semillas.

Siempre es temporada de plantas en Filipinas. Aunque seguimos una temporada de siembra, el suelo siempre está listo para cualquier semilla. Pero por el bien de los nutrientes del suelo y la temporada de frutos, la siembra sigue un ciclo de cultivo. Por ejemplo, para estar seguros de una buena cosecha para las batatas, plantaremos en mayo y cosecharemos en octubre. Para tener un nuevo lote de batatas, la siembra se puede hacer en septiembre y la cosecha en febrero. Las batatas necesitan la Iluvia, así como suficiente sol. Durante estos meses, las batatas crecen y cosechan bien.

Esta temporada de cultivo en el hemisferio norte siempre es una sorpresa para mí. Necesito estudiarlo deliberadamente porque perder los días correctos de cosecha significa una mala cosecha. Y eso es lo que tuvimos el año pasado. Agotamos los nutrientes del suelo para nada.

Sin embargo, la primavera siempre es divertida. Es el momento de empezar de nuevo. Hay una nueva vida. Hay una nueva esperanza. Nuevos comienzos, nuevas esperanzas, nuevas expectativas.

¿Sabías que la Pascua está programada en primavera cuando sale la primera luna llena? ¿Por qué? Nótese que la Pascua es una fiesta móvil a diferencia de la natividad del 25 de diciembre. Cuando el primer Concilio de Nicea estableció ese cálculo de la fecha de la Pascua, en él está la consideración de la riqueza de la celebración. La luna llena. El equinoccio de primavera. La importancia de esta temporada. Tenga en cuenta que la resurrección es la primavera de una vida nueva y eterna. Después del invierno muerto, la vida brota al comienzo de los días más cálidos. Florecen hermosas flores. Comienza la temporada de fructificación.

La Pascua es exactamente eso. Para reflexionar sobre la belleza de la primayera es también una lectura del mensaje de Pascua. Mientras nos preparamos para la celebración de la Pascua, que tengamos la preparación para dar la bienvenida a esta fiesta.-30-


