Fr. Cit's Column

Who runs your Church?

Your pastor? The Pope? The ministers? The whole community?

Our Church is run by the Holy Spirit. In this period, as we wait for Jesus' second coming, the Holy Spirit is with us, empowering us, guiding us, strengthening us and protecting us. In the name of Jesus, whose authority is upon the Church, all ministers and all who are called to the baptism are used by God as instruments to make the Truth known in all corners of the world.

Inspired. The Holy Spirit is a power that lets us do (or witness to) the power of Christ. Allow the Holy Spirit to move you through his power and inspiration. Like a voice, or a pinch in the cheek, He lets us know what to say, how to think or which good is beneficial.

As a priest, I depended on His inspiration. Not that I have the facility to hear or know his leadings. No. It takes a lot of discernment. Almost always at the crossroads, there is always the dilemma whether the Holy Spirit points or not to which direction to take.

Am I hearing him? And if I hear him, is he saying a yes or a no?

Often, I easily drop the process of listening to the voice of the Holy Spirit. Discernment is not easy. It is not easy, there is no facility to know whether what you hear is yourself (ego) or the voice of the Holy Spirit. That is why, Spiritual formation here is very important. A sound spirituality and formed conscience shaped by the moral teachings of the Church and catechism are important ingredients to a baptized's good ears to the voice of the Holy Spirit.

Wonder why we do not know the will of God?

Let us train ourselves to know the Holy Spirit. He is the advocate Jesus sent in his name. It is He who lets us persevere as Christ's witnesses..>

Inspirado. El Espíritu Santo es un poder que nos permite hacer (o dar testimonio) del poder de Cristo. Permita que el Espíritu Santo nos mueva a través de su poder e inspiración. Como una voz, o un pellizco en la mejilla, Él nos hace saber qué decir, cómo pensar o qué bien es beneficioso.

Como sacerdote, dependía de Su inspiración. No es que yo tenga la facilidad de oír o conocer sus consejos. No. Se necesita mucho discernimiento. Casi siempre en la encrucijada, siempre está el dilema de si el Espíritu Santo señala o no qué dirección tomar.

¿Lo estoy escuchando? Y si lo escucho, ¿está diciendo un sí o un no?

A menudo, abandono fácilmente el proceso de escuchar la voz del Espíritu Santo. El discernimiento no es fácil. No solo es fácil, no hay facilidad para saber si lo que escuchas es a ti mismo (ego) o la voz del Espíritu Santo. Es por eso que la formación espiritual aquí es muy importante. Una espiritualidad sana y una conciencia formada, moldeada por las enseñanzas morales de la Iglesia y el catecismo, son ingredientes importantes para que los buenos oídos de un bautizado sean para la voz del Espíritu Santo.

¿Nos preguntamos por qué no conocemos la voluntad de Dios?

Entrenémonos para conocer al Espíritu Santo. Él es el abogado que Jesús envió en su nombre. Es Él quien nos permite perseverar como testigos de Cristo.>



Order of the Mass Described in 155 A.D.

- Sunday**
Liturgy of the Word: Old Test. & Gospels
On the day we call the day of the sun, all who dwell in the city or country gather in the same place. The memoirs of the apostles and the writings of the prophets are read, as much as time permits.
- A priest gives the homily**
When the reader has finished, he who presides over those gathered admonishes and challenges them to imitate these beautiful things.
- Prayers of the faithful**
Then we all rise together and offer prayers for ourselves . . . and for all others, wherever they may be, so that we may be found righteous by our life and actions, and faithful to the commandments, so as to obtain eternal salvation.
- Sign of Peace**
When the prayers are concluded we exchange the kiss.
- Liturgy of the Eucharist: Presentation of Gifts**
Then someone brings bread and a cup of water and wine mixed together to him who presides over the brethren.
- Prayer over the offerings: Eucharistic prayers (consecration)**
He takes them and offers praise and glory to the Father of the universe, through the name of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and for a considerable time he gives thanks (in Greek: eucharistian) that we have been judged worthy of these gifts.
- Memorial Acclamation & Great Amen**
When he has concluded the prayers and thanksgivings, all present give voice to an acclamation by saying: 'Amen.'
- Distribution of Holy Communion**
When he who presides has given thanks and the people have responded, those whom we call deacons give to those present the "eucharisted" bread, wine and water and take them to those who are absent.
