Fr. Cit's Column

Happy Fathers' Day. Salute to all of you, men, for your strength, hard work and discipline. Your part in the family is always necessary. A family is blessed with your being you.

I wanted to define who is a good father myself, in that I have vowed to become a good father. In my mind it is to do what my Dad did, not what would make a good definition. When my Dad died, I took some of his responsibilities. One of those was to be the family's provider. I was never happy to experience lack of resources. I was limited but in my little way, I helped my Mom to earn. Mom was doing house help. We did laundry. I did laundry to earn money. It was hard work. My Mom did not give up. I did not give up. But that experience made me realize that intent alone was not enough. The realities surrounding us were not friendly to poor people like us. Despite the drive to fulfill our goal, the way to it was super challenging. The playing field was uneven, always favorable to those who have the advantage in the society.

Without money, without name, it was hardest to overcome our financial burdens. My eyes were opened to the realities my parents were handling, the hardships that my Dad confronted. He had his limitations. That was inevitable. That was who he was. And whether or not his limitations tipped the scale to our disadvantage, nevertheless he was always focused on his goals. He was always trying. He loved being a father. I do not have the same focus of patience and direction that my Dad had being a father. Thanks to those years that I was obliged to train as a father. I realized, fatherhood is not about providing a comfortable life. It is about doing the good of sharing his whole self, strengths and weaknesses alike.>

No me rendí. Pero esa experiencia me hizo darme cuenta de que la intención por sí sola no era suficiente. Las realidades que nos rodeaban no eran amigables con la gente pobre como nosotros. A pesar del impulso para cumplir nuestro objetivo, el camino hacia él fue muy desafiante. El campo de juego era desigual, siempre favorable a los que tenían ventaja en la sociedad.

19 Sin dinero, sin nombre, era más difícil superar nuestras cargas financieras. Mis ojos se abrieron a las realidades que mis padres estaban manejando, las dificultades que enfrentaba mi papá. Tenía sus limitaciones. Eso era inevitable. Eso era lo que era. Y ya sea que sus limitaciones inclinaran la balanza a nuestro favor o no, sin embargo, siempre se centró en sus objetivos. Siempre lo estaba intentando. Le encantaba ser padre.

20 No tengo el mismo enfoque, paciencia y dirección que tenía mi papá siendo padre. Gracias a esos años que me vi obligado a formarme como padre. Me di cuenta de que la paternidad no se trata de hacer el mayor bien proporcionando una vida cómoda. Se trata de hacer el bien compartiendo todo su ser, fortalezas y debilidades por igual.>

THE DOGMA OF THE TRINITY



THE DIVINE PERSONS ARE RELATIVE TO ONE ANOTHER

Because it does not divide the divine unity, the real distinction of the persons from one another resides solely in the relationships which relate them to one another: "In the relational names of the persons the Father is related to the Son, the Son to the Father, and the Holy Spirit to both. While they are called three persons in view of their relations, we believe in one nature or substance."

Indeed "everything [in them] is one where there is no opposition of relationship."

"Because of that unity the Father is wholly in the Son and wholly in the Holy Spirit; the Son is wholly in the Father and wholly in the Holy Spirit; the Holy Spirit is wholly in the Father and wholly in the Son." (CCC 255)

THE TRINITY IS ONE (IN DIVINE NATURE)


We do not confess three Gods, but one God in three persons, the "consubstantial Trinity".

The divine persons do not share the one divinity among themselves but each of them is God whole and entire...In the words of the Fourth Lateran Council (1215), "Each of the persons is that supreme reality, viz., the divine substance, essence or nature." (CCC 253)

THE DIVINE PERSONS ARE REALLY DISTINCT FROM ONE ANOTHER

"God is one but not solitary." ...

"Father", "Son", "Holy Spirit" are not simply names designating modalities of the divine being, for they are really distinct from one another...They are distinct from one another in their relations of origin: "It is the Father who generates, the Son who is begotten, and the Holy Spirit who proceeds." The divine Unity is Triune. (CCC 254)


