Fr. Cit's Column

How to prepare for Mass (and for receiving the Eucharist). Look forward to the coming Sunday...continued from previous. Today

we have plenty of resources we can refer to for our Mass preparations. Ahead of time, we can read and pray with the Sunday readings. Familiarity of the readings help situate us in the Sunday celebration. How? We know the Sunday's celebration/season. By knowing the Sunday celebration, we have a sense of what is to happen in the celebration. For example, a Sunday in Ordinary Time will be slightly different from a Sunday Mass during the Easter Season as a Sunday Mass celebrating a Solemnity. This Sunday is the feast day of Sts. Peter and Paul. They were martyred. Red is the color of the celebration of their martyrdom. The readings are about St. Peter and St. Paul's ministry as princes of the Church, however that is not what makes them the ultimate focus of the Mass. In fact, through the life and ministry of these two saints, the whole point of the Mass is the work of God made effective in Sts. Peter and Paul as Christ's missionary workers on earth.

Come to Church early. On the dot is not ideal. You are not visiting a friend or relatives. You are meeting Christ. The right practice is to come early. And for younger families, if your children are causing the delay, then adjust your preparation time. Allow more time for your preparation (and if travelling, add time of travel too) so that you can leave the house and be in the church at least 15 minutes before Mass. Why so early? Again, coming to church is meeting Christ. By arriving early, you get to pray, and be disposed for the celebration of the Mass. To be disposed for the Mass is also time to quiet the children, or quiet the self, letting the thoughts or worries of the day to go by focusing on the church "things". Surely the environment will help. If you think the younger kids will not have enough patience to sit for a long time, wait until they get used to that practice. It involves habit formation. Keep practicing. (To be continued...)>

Cómo prepararse para la Misa (y para recibir la Eucaristía). Esperamos con ansias el próximo domingo... Continuación de la anterior. Hoy tenemos muchos recursos a los que podemos referirnos para nuestros preparativos para la Misa. Con anticipación, podemos leer y orar con las lecturas dominicales. La familiaridad de las lecturas nos ayuda a situarnos en la celebración dominical. ¿Cómo? Conocemos la celebración del domingo. Al conocer la celebración del domingo, tenemos una idea de lo que va a suceder en la celebración. Por ejemplo, un domingo del Tiempo Ordinario será ligeramente diferente de una misa dominical durante el tiempo de Pascua como una misa dominical que celebra una solemnidad. Este domingo es la fiesta de San Pedro y San Pablo. Fueron martirizados. El rojo es el color de la celebración de su martirio. Las lecturas son sobre el ministerio de San Pedro y San Pablo como príncipes de la Iglesia, sin embargo, ninguna de ellas hará de estos santos el foco principal de la Misa. De hecho, a través de la vida y el ministerio de estos dos santos, todo el punto de la Misa es la obra de Dios hecha efectiva en San Pedro y San Pablo como obreros misioneros de Cristo en la tierra.

Ven a la Iglesia temprano. En el punto no es lo ideal. No está visitando a un amigo o familiar. Te estás encontrando con Cristo. La práctica correcta es llegar temprano. Y para las familias más jóvenes, si sus hijos están causando el retraso, entonces ajuste su tiempo de preparación. Permita más tiempo para su preparación (y si viaja, agregue también el tiempo de viaje) para que pueda salir de la casa y estar en la iglesia al menos 15 minutos antes de la misa. ¿Por qué tan temprano? Una vez más, venir a la iglesia es encontrarse con Cristo. Al llegar temprano, puedes rezar y estar dispuesto para la celebración de la Misa. Estar dispuesto para la Misa es también tiempo de tranquilizar a los niños, o de tranquilizarse a sí mismo, dejando que los pensamientos o preocupaciones del día se vayan centrando en las "cosas" de la iglesia. Seguro que el entorno ayudará. Si cree que los niños más pequeños no tendrán suficiente paciencia para sentarse durante mucho tiempo, espere hasta que se acostumbren a esa práctica. Implica la formación de hábitos. Sigue practicando. (Continuará...)>


