Fr. Cit's Column Discipline. Classroom management is tricky. There is no one management technic that fits all. Every classroom is unique. Every student is unique. Every teacher is unique. I taught in two Catholic institutions. One was a Dominican-run High School; the other was a diocesan seminary. I also taught in a private non-sectarian high school. You would think that the discipline in both Catholic schools would be easy. No. In fact, I had experienced the worst disciplining among the high school seminarians. They liked to play around. Is the classroom (school) the foundation for discipline?

Discipline is defined as the practice of training oneself or others to obey rules or a code of behavior. It involves punishment for infractions of those rules or code of behavior. Institutions like family, school, church and community are bastions of discipline. A healthier community is made up of law abiding, God-fearing and respectful people. That presupposes that the members of a healthy community come from a healthy family. The home, which is also the domestic church, is the small community where discipline is honed and sustained. Other institutions, like the school, reinforce and further that discipline learned at home. It is so damning when parents come to school and complain why the school could not discipline their kids. I just hoped that they heard their own complain loud enough for them to ask themselves if they had disciplined their children well.

25 When we were kids, we were disciplined at home. We were afraid to be reprimanded by authorities. It was a shame when our parents are called to the school's guidance office.

26 When I taught, we (teachers) were concerned parents were coming to school to complain about our classroom management skills.

27 What does that tell us? In a society where parents blame other authorities for their children's bad discipline, that is tantamount to the corrosion of public morals.>

28 Disciplina. La gestión del aula es complicada. No existe una técnica de gestión que se adapte a todos. Cada salón de clases es único. Cada estudiante es único. Cada maestro es único.

29 Enseñe en dos instituciones católicas. Una era una escuela secundaria administrada por dominicos; el otro era un seminario diocesano. También enseñé en una escuela secundaria privada no sectaria. Uno pensaría que la disciplina en ambas escuelas católicas sería fácil. No. De hecho, había experimentado la peor disciplina entre los seminaristas de la escuela secundaria. Les gustaba jugar.

¿Es el aula (escuela) la base de la disciplina? La disciplina se define como la práctica de entrenarse a sí mismo o a otros para obedecer reglas o un código de comportamiento. Implica castigo por infracciones de esas reglas o código de conducta.

Instituciones como la familia, la escuela, la iglesia y la comunidad son bastiones de disciplina. Una comunidad más saludable está formada por personas respetuosas, temerosas de Dios y respetuosas. Eso presupone que los miembros de una comunidad sana provienen de una familia sana. El hogar, que también es la iglesia doméstica, es la pequeña comunidad donde se perfecciona y sostiene la disciplina. Otras instituciones, como la escuela, refuerzan y promueven esa disciplina aprendida en casa.

Es tan condenatorio cuando los padres vienen a la escuela y se quejan de por qué la escuela no pudo disciplinar a sus hijos. Solo esperaba que escucharan su propia queja lo suficientemente fuerte como para que se preguntaran si habían disciplinado bien a sus hijos. Cuando éramos niños, éramos disciplinados en casa. Teníamos miedo de ser reprendidos por las autoridades. Fue una pena cuando llamaron a nuestros padres a la oficina de consejero de la escuela.

Cuando enseñé, a nosotros (los maestros) nos preocupaba que los padres vinieran a la escuela para quejarse de nuestras habilidades de manejo del aula. ¿Qué nos dice eso? En una sociedad donde los padres culpan a otras autoridades por la mala disciplina de sus hijos, eso equivale a la corrosión de la moral pública.>
