Fr. Cit's Column >

Conscience. It is the small voice inside that tells us the right from the wrong. It also guides us to choose the right and do the good. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (1796), conscience is a judgement of reason by which human person recognizes the moral quality of a concrete act.

Does each individual have conscience? Or only those who profess faith can have conscience? Everybody has conscience. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says that those who do not know the Gospel, are exposed to evil, and are enslaved by their own passions judge wrongly and act wrongly due to erroneous conscience.

Conscience can be formed. Institutions like family, church and school help in the formation of good conscience. Values, morals and right conduct are their premium because the goal of these institutions is to promote and sustain a standard good in the society. A just and humane society is livable. Harmony, unity and cooperation, and respect for each other's rights are staple goods in a community of persons.

A family that teaches a child discipline provides a community a chance for the promotion of the good. On the other hand, an undisciplined child will make a real challenge in the promotion of the good.

If a person knows and believes in God and perseveres to live their faith, they contribute more to this program of good. Why? Because their conscience is informed by faith. They judge according to the teachings of God, and they conduct their affairs relevant to the salvation of their souls.

Divine judgement is (Luke 6:38) "Give and gifts will be given to you; a good measure, packed together, shaken down, and overflowing, will be poured into your lap. For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you."

Conciencia. Es la pequeña voz interior la que nos dice lo correcto de lo incorrecto. También nos guía a elegir lo correcto y hacer el bien. Según el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica (1796), la conciencia es un juicio de la razón por el cual la persona humana reconoce la cualidad moral de un acto concreto.

¿Cada individuo tiene conciencia? ¿O solo aquellos que profesan la fe pueden tener conciencia? Todo el mundo tiene conciencia. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica dice que aquellos que no conocen el Evangelio, están expuestos al mal y son esclavizados por sus propias pasiones juzgan erróneamente y actúan erróneamente debido a una conciencia errónea.

Se puede formar la conciencia. Instituciones como la familia, la iglesia y la escuela ayudan en la formación de una buena conciencia. Los valores, la moral y la conducta correcta son su prima porque el objetivo de estas instituciones es promover y mantener un bien estándar en la sociedad. Una sociedad justa y humana es vivible. La armonía, la unidad y la cooperación, y el respeto de los derechos de los demás son bienes básicos en una comunidad de personas.

Una familia que enseña disciplina a un niño brinda a la comunidad la oportunidad de promover el bien. Por otro lado, un niño indisciplinado será un verdadero desafío en la promoción del bien.

Si una persona conoce y cree en Dios y persevera para vivir su fe, contribuye más a este programa de bien. ¿Por qué? Porque su conciencia está informada por la fe. Juzgan de acuerdo con las enseñanzas de Dios, y conducen sus asuntos relevantes para la salvación de sus almas.

El juicio divino es (Lucas 6:38) "Dad y se os darán regalos; una buena medida, empaquetada, sacudida y rebosante, será vertida en tu regazo. Porque la medida con que midáis, os será medida".




